Monday Minders – July 4, 2016 First Presbyterian of Hector & Lodi Presbyterian Church

Thank you for allowing me two weeks off for vacation and to attend General Assembly in Portland, Oregon. It's a beautiful area. Nancy and I were thankful to have the opportunity to visit the Timberline Lodge on Mount Hood (in the middle of a snow squall, no less!), the coast (Cannon Beach and Tillamook), and some of the sights in Portland (& enjoy Voodoo Donuts and salmon).

Attending the 222nd General Assembly (GA) was also a great experience (though sitting through eight days of meetings, some of which ran almost to midnight, wasn't exactly vacation). Some joyful things happened at GA; disappointments, as well. I'll be sharing some of this in church and in Monday Minders this month. Since this is Independence Day, it seems appropriate to lift up a couple of the more historic actions of the General Assembly.

For the first time we elected co-moderators. In the past, we elected a moderator and a vicemoderator. In 2009, then vice-moderator, Rev. Byron Wade, was a special guest and preacher at Hector's 200th anniversary. Sadly, vice-moderators never get the same special treatment throughout the denomination as moderators do.


This time we elected two co-moderators who will split the duties evenly between them. For the first time, both are women. Rev. Dr. Jan Edmiston is the executive of the Presbytery of Chicago, a white woman in her 50's. Rev. T. Denise Anderson is a pastor in the Washington, D.C. area, an African-American woman who is 37. Rev. Anderson is the first African-American moderator and the youngest moderator in our history. Among the responsibilities of moderators are to go around to the churches in our denomination to maintain connections, to listen to the concerns and hopes of our members, and to discern where God is leading us.

We elected the Rev. Dr. J. Herbert Nelson as Stated Clerk of the denomination, the first African-American in this position in the Presbyterian Church (USA). Prior to his election, J. Herbert Nelson was the head of our denomination's Office of Social Witness in Washington, D.C. He also has been a much-requested preacher at youth conferences. I had the honor of meeting him a few years ago at a presbytery-hosted event.

We also officially adopted a new confession of faith, The Confession of Belhar, which came out of the struggle against apartheid in South Africa. This is our first confession from the Global South. As the voting results were announced, the room erupted in a standing ovation and the singing of the South African song, "Freedom Is Coming!" We'll be reading parts of this in worship during July.
