Family Events

Education

Here at Harbor View we view all we do as part of our Christian Education. It is church life that truly helps us grow in faith, and find our way in this world. Thus it is important to us to include our Children in all the opportunities we can here with the church.

Part of maturing in the faith though is learning about the stories of scripture and about our faith traditions. This is done mainly through our formal education programs.

Sunday School for Children

Each Sunday morning we hold children's classes from age 2 through 5th grade. These classes are broken up into age groups with curriculum specifically selected for that groups developmental stage. We use *We Believe*, a curriculum created specifically for Presbyterians by Presbyterians. In different ways, each age level includes content from Reformed creeds, confessions, catechisms and statements of faith. *We Believe* tells the stories of our faith in a variety of ways to allow for different learning styles. This curriculum helps all participants develop a common understanding of how we as Presbyterians understand the Word of God and apply that understanding in our daily lives.

On some occasions we also hold special classes on certain aspects of the faith. These include classes focused on Worship, the Sacraments, Outreach, and Reading the Bible. These classes are usually created and led by our Director of Educational Ministries.



Vacation Bible School

Each summer we hold a week long Vacation Bible School program. This program is a wonderful time of learning and fun. Children meet together for worship, and then visit a number of stations throughout the church such as Bible Storytelling, Crafts, Music, and Recreation before coming back to praise God together before the evening ends. This year's program is the Everywhere Fun Fair and promises to be a joy for all involved.

Worship

We offer a number of ways for children to get involved in worship. We feel it is important that children are included in worship and encourage families to join us together each Sunday in this way.

Children's Choir

Dr. Gary Hill leads our Children's Choir Program for Age 4 through 5th Grade. During the school year they meet each Sunday from 4 to 4:45 to rehearse and prepare to sing on various Sunday mornings. This is a wonderful space for children to grow in their love of music while praising God.



Worship Bags

Each week for worship in both services there are "Worship Bags" available. These denim bags hang in the narthex outside the sanctuary for children to pick up and use in worship. These bags include activities, stories, and other things to help connect children with parts of worship which are beyond their attention span. They are not a replacement for worship, and we hope children participate as fully as they are able in the service.

Children's Message

During both of our Sunday morning worship services we include a children's message each week before the sermon. Children are welcome to come join the leader each week on the front steps as a message is delivered specifically for them.

Children in Worship

We truly believe that children are to be included fully in the life of the church. So not only do we encourage children to participate in worship, we also like to encourage them to take on leadership roles. This may be as a greeter, an usher, offering a prayer or welcome, or helping to lead music. Children are part of our community fully, and we welcome them to worship fully together with us.
