

Do you ever think about death? I don't very often. However, as a pastor, I can't help but think about it whenever someone dies, which seems to happen with greater frequency lately. The truth is, death is the eventual byproduct of life for all of us. We will all die. Some at the end of a long life and some where it seems that life has been cut short.

Last month the matriarch of our church, Hettie Lou Downing, passed away. I was privileged to be with her the last day of her life. She still recognized me and the sparkle in her eyes was still there. We talked, well, I mostly talked ©, and I prayed with her. There was no need to reassure her because she had no doubt as to what was in store for her when she moved on.

Then yesterday (as I write this) my brother-in-law, Brent Street, my sister's husband, passed away after a brief bout with cancer. I also had the privilege to be with him just a few days before he died. He was the only one who could get away with calling me "Tommy" and as I came in and as I left he called me just that! Although my sister is an avowed atheist, Brent believed in God, and we had that connection that none of the rest of my family shared with him. I was so glad that I was there and could assure him that soon he would be headed home to be with God and all those who had preceded him in death. I prayed with him and felt God's spirit all around and in us.

When I visited with Hettie Lou's family, there was sadness, but there was also the realization that death was just a way station on the way to eternal life. There was a sense of loss, but also a celebration that Hettie Lou was no longer in pain AND had been reunited, not only with those who preceded her in death, including a husband and three of her four children, but also her Savior, Jesus Christ.

There is a comfort in knowing that this is not all there is. There is a comfort in knowing that when we die our energy doesn't just float back into the universe (as my sister believes). There is a comfort in knowing that there is a loving, compassionate, and merciful God and Savior who is waiting patiently for us to return. It takes away much of the fear out of dying.

I feel a little bit sorry for my sister who understands none of this. She now is alone, and although she is strong and is doing well, she misses out on one of the most important promises of the Gospel message: That Jesus has prepared a room for us ... for all of us (including, I believe, my sister). Boy, will she be surprised when she crosses over ... pleasantly, I hope.

For me ... I miss Hettie Lou and I miss my brother-in-law. But that hole in my heart is tempered by the knowledge that it is for just a little while. The time will come when we will all be reunited and join together to sing and dance and celebrate!

Thank God, God is Good!

And with that, I will see you on Sunday ©



Immanuel House. They got to know the refugee's and hear their stories. Everyone was grateful for the dinner and more than willing to share their stories and thoughts.

On Friday, April 1, Lynn Hines, Linda Buckley and Yvonne Miller provided a soup, salad and sandwich luncheon to the ladies of the Women's Gathering Place at First Presbyterian Church of San Jose. They enjoyed talking with several women and hearing why they come to WGP. Linda even said she would like to volunteer there after she retires in June.

On Saturday, April 2 Mike Manley, David and Yvonne Miller, Cathy Warrick and Vicki O'Hara worked at Santa Maria Urban Ministry (SMUM) pulling weeds and spreading tan bark in their beautiful rose garden. David went back during the



week and planted some geraniums. The HOPE group also raised money to help purchase the bark.

On Sunday, April 3 busy hands packed 101 lunches for Front Door Ministry run by First Presbyterian Church of San Jose. This ministry hands out about 150 lunches each



day. We also donated 5 cases of water, a case of individual fruit cups and many, many packages of cookies!! Thank you to all who donated food for the lunches. Another group wrote letters for Bread for the World. These are letters sent to our Congressional representatives urging them to pass legislation for \$230 million dollars in food aid for women and children.

Sunday evening about 30 people joined together for a potluck before our Faith in Action worship service. All three churches that meet at STHPC participated in the worship service. Someone from each FIA activity summed up their activity. Zoe Walker had a slide presentation of the Youth's blanket making project. Each pastor also gave a short homily. Rev. Ken Williams, the United Christian Fellowship pastor, spoke about action with faith – putting ourselves out there to be the hands and feet of Jesus. Pastor Kim from the Young Nak Korean congregation showed slides and told of their weekly Thursday morning ministry to the homeless at St. James Park in downtown San Jose. Pastor Tom spoke about the importance of acting out our faith by helping others. It was a very inspiring service.
