


# CARING FOR ALL



The first Sunday in October we celebrate World Communion Sunday. At Parents' Afternoon Out last Wednesday, we talked about remembering Jesus through communion. The children built and colored churches from Iceland and Russia that look so different from our church, but the people who worship there remember Jesus through communion

in the same way we do. We also set our communion table and ate painted bread and drank grape juice boxes to share a meal together.

Of course communion is a practice rich with symbolism and connections to everything important to our practice as Christians, no matter what age we are and no matter in what part of the world we live. This is the prayer by Robert Louis Stevenson that we used to remember other children around the world before we ate together:

"It is very nice to think the world is full of meat and drink with little children saying grace in every Christian kind of place. Amen



At home this month, find a time to pray with your children, maybe at meal time but any time that works best for your family. Talk about how we remember Jesus when we share meals together and pray to remember what we have in common with Christians all around the world.

In the upcoming months your children's Sunday School teachers will start spending some time each week teaching different age groups the Doxology, the Lord's Prayer, and the Apostles' Creed. These prayers all express something different when we use them in worship, but they have in common that they are used by Christians all over the world and have been for many many years.

My hope this month is that we remember that Jesus is the bread of life and that all our Christian brothers and sisters around the world are fed by his Word whenever we come together.




Troop 7 Spends Night Aboard Historic USS Yorktown

Troop 7 recently walked in the steps of our country's heroes while participating in the Patriots Point Naval and Maritime Museum's camping program aboard the historic World War II aircraft carrier USS Yorktown on Charleston Harbor. During the trip, scouts became "shipmates" while touring the museum's three 70 year old warships: the USS Yorktown, World War II destroyer USS Laffey, and Cold War submarine USS Clamagore. The group also learned about the Vietnam War in the museum's new, interactive, Vietnam Experience. The landside exhibit is a 2.5 acre recreation of a Brown Water Naval Support Base and Marine Fire Artillery base.


