Join us on November 13 and 20, and bring a friend.





We appreciate your understanding and patience as the Photo Directory Committee works to reschedule our photo sessions that were postponed the week after Hurricane

Matthew. As soon as a new plan is in place, we will share it via the bulletin, weekly email and the newsletter!

If you are like I am, the past weeks have been trying times, filled with worry about my own home and family and my community. One sunny afternoon as I walked with my girls to see the swollen river, after the hurricane had passed and as we waited for the river to crest, I was doing my best to use my reason and faith to overcome the overwhelming feeling I was having of how could God let this happen. At that moment, my

four-year-old daughter said, "Mom, why did God want it to storm and flood?" All I could manage as a response was, "I don't know. I was just wondering the same thing."

As Christians, the knowledge of a suffering world is not new to us. We know through the stories of Scripture and our own experiences of the world that suffering is a problem that is hard to explain and hard to wrap our minds around.

How timely, then, is our stewardship theme of caring for all. When we are faced with suffering in our community and in our own lives as we have been with the hurricane and the flood, we are called to respond using our gifts with the help of the Holy Spirit. How do we convey that to our children? We can talk about what happened and we can talk about God's presence with us.

Talking about what happened

- Answer questions and be direct, but don't give unnecessary details about the event.
- Ask your child what they know or what they have heard and respond to their information and concerns.
- When something bad has happened, children need to know they are safe and loved. Reassure your child that you are there for them and that other helpers are doing all they can to take care of everyone who needs help.

Talking about God's role when people and the world are hurting

- We know that God loves all people and that God is always with us, even when terrible things happen. Luke 12:1-7
- Let your child know how your family is helping. Show your child how you help by letting them participate and talk about how important it is to find opportunities to be a helper.


