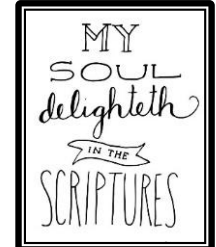


Scripture Readings

Signup GENIUS IS IN PLACE for everyone to volunteer without a hassle.

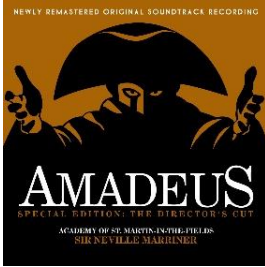
The system will send you a confirmation and remind you 4 days prior to your scheduled date. Please follow the two instructions below:

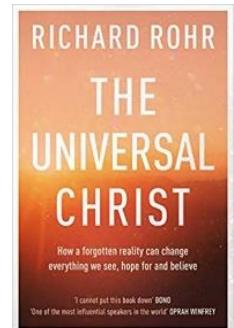
“Back to Basics” Bible Study – Wednesday, Jan. 29 at 10am (fellowship hall)

Good Shepherd Center Needs

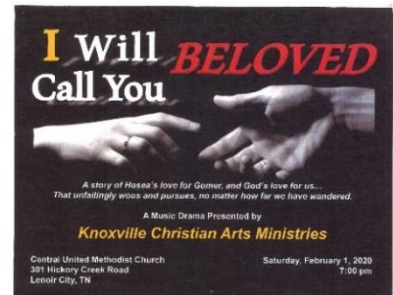
