CHOIR CORNER NEWS

Well, here we are closing in on the end of the "Choir Year." It's almost summer with weddings and graduations, or visits to the shore or the mountains to open up the summer house. We've stopped our Thursday evening choir rehearsals, and instead of singing two anthems each Sunday, for the next five weeks we'll sing only ONE anthem each Sunday.

Our anthem today, in honor of Memorial Day, is a choral setting of the very famous World War I poem, In Flanders Fields. During the early days of the Second Battle of Ypres in 1915, a young Canadian artillery officer, Lieutenant Alexis Helmer, was killed when an exploding German artillery shell landed near him. He was serving in the same Canadian artillery unit as a friend of his, a Canadian military doctor and artillery commander named Major John McCrae. As the brigade doctor, McCrae was asked to conduct Helmer's burial service. Later that evening, after the burial service, John wrote the first draft of his now famous poem.

The anthem we sing this morning was composed by John Jacobson, and the choral arrangement was written by Roger Emerson in 1998. Emerson is one of the most widely performed choral composers in America today. He received his degree in Music Education from Southern Oregon University. Roger is best known for creating "songs kids love to sing," including such best sellers as "We Are The World" and "The Greatest Love of All." Even more familiar music composed by Emerson includes selections from "Little Mermaid," "Beauty and The Beast" and "Seasons of Love" from RENT.
