## SPOT LIGHT SERIES

### ANDREA A. WOOD, SEMINARY INTERN

During a period of new peace, hopefulness, and uncertainty following fourteen years of civil war in Southern Rhodesia, my life began. I was an independence baby, born at the same time as this new nation of Zimbabwe, born into a time of

reconciliation between black and white and past and future. While the nascent country found its bearings, daily life for its citizens continued: a christening at Trinity Presbyterian Church in Salisbury; Sunday worship, school, and lunches at my grandparents' house; and the days of a child meeting the wonders of the world for the first time. Yet, the post-independence years were a shaky time and when an opportunity opened for my parents to emigrate to the United States, they took it, making the toughest decision of their lives to ensure a better one for their two children.

In January of 2012, as I was just beginning what I thought was to be my last tour in the Navy, I returned to Norfolk, Virginia. First Presbyterian Church of Norfolk was just beginning a program to read through the Bible from Genesis to Revelation in ninety days (in which the reader is not allowed to skip any words because, as the program's founder says, then you have not really read the entire Bible). As the pastor introduced "B90X," I realized that, although I had grown up in the church, I had only read bits and pieces of the Bible. Even though was concerned that I would not have the time to devote to reading the Bible for an hour each day because I was just beginning a new and busy job, I accepted this challenge and I am so glad that I did. I completed my first front to back reading of the Bible in 180 days and it transformed my life! Reading God's word every day engendered a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and I became on fire for Jesus! Since that first year, each January I have started B90X in earnest again in hopes of someday reaching that 90 day goal (it is yet to happen). The only years that I have missed have been the ones while I am in Seminary! Over each reading, the books in the Bible continue to reveal deeper truths of the universe and unfailingly point toward a loving and compassionate God. It is this God that I serve joyfully on my journey toward pastoral ministry.
