

#### This week in Church School

This week in church school students continue in their journey learning about the story of Moses. Previously we learned about the burning bush, the call of Moses, and about the command to 'let my people go'. Now, we turn to the story of crossing of the Red Sea (alternatively the sea of reeds) from Exodus 13:17-15:21. This is a powerful story of God delivering people out of their oppression and slavery. Talk with your children about the systems of oppression present today that are on your heart. Pray with them about it and explore ways together you could work toward bringing more of God's freedom into the world.
