Bells of Peace

November 11, 2018 marks 100 years since the end of World War I and along with it, the most lethal battle fought by American soldiers to date--the Meuse-Argonne Offensive. A battle which lasted 47 days, resulting in the death of 26,277 Americans.

To honor those who gave their lives in defense of freedom a proclamation from the "Bells of Peace" nationwide campaign calls for ringing bells at 11 a.m. to recognize the exact time and date the Armistice was signed between the Allies and Germany in 1918.

The program started as an initiative in 2014, "Bells of Peace" is designed to commemorate the service and sacrifice of those who served in World War I and all veterans. To honor the end of WWI and the signing of the Armistice on November 11, 1918, Wilton Presbyterian Church will be participating with the "Bells of Peace" by ringing our bells in remembrance of those who served and sacrificed in World War I on this Veterans Day.

May God Bless ALL the men ⊕ women who have served and those who continue to serve our great country.
