CHOIR CORNER NEWS

The original song, "For All the Saints", was written as a processional hymn by the Anglican Bishop of Wakefield, UK. The hymn was sung to the melody "Sarum" by the Victorian composer Joseph Barnby. The new English hymnal of 1906 used a new setting composed by Ralph Vaughan Williams which he called Sine Nomine (literally, "without name") in reference to its use on the Feast of All Saints. The arrangement of that hymn that we sing today was written by Edwin Robertson, a clergyman, writer and broadcaster. Robertson was born in 1912 and died in November 2007. Born in London, Robertson saw little of his father, a ship's cooper, but was devoted to his deeply religious mother. Life was spartan and he never ceased being a puritan in the best sense of the word. A side note to the Sine Nomine story: the renowned British composer Charles Stanford had composed an anthem titled "Engleberg" that was specifically to be used in concert with Sine Nomine.

Today, we know that anthem as "When in Our Music God is Glorified". Which, lo and behold, is our second anthem today. The original text was written specifically for Stanford's "Engleberg" tune. The choral arrangement we sing today was composed by contemporary composer, Emily Crocker. Emily was a public school music teacher 15 years in Texas then she founded the Milwaukee Children's Choir in 1994 and was its artistic director until 2009. She has received numerous awards including having been named a Distinguished Alumna of the Texas Woman's University and an Honored Alumnus of the University of North Texas.
