### **Today in Church School**

This week in church school we will be exploring the metaphors of the mustard seed and yeast from **Luke 13:18-21**. This story is just after a healing where Jesus isn't supposed to be doing work on the sabbath. Then Jesus compares the reign of God to a mustard seed that grows into a home for birds in the middle of a garden and a woman mixing yeast into dough that rises. Both examples show work that is not thought highly of at the time and both show the expansive power of God's reign. This is an example when Jesus showed that God's love is bigger than our potentially restrictive rules and bigger than our expectations.

When have you noticed God's love was bigger than you imagined? Talk to your kids about times where your understanding of God's reign got bigger.
