TODAY IN CHURCH SCHOOL

This week in church school students will explore the topic of banquets. In Luke 14:1-24, we hear a story of Jesus at the house of a pharisee for a meal. Jesus tells a parable about a great banquet where the invited guests have excuses to not come but then he has his servants go out into the streets and invite everyone in, but the original invited quests will get nothing. This story is both disturbing for those of us who feel invited and a revolutionary promise of comfort to those of us who feel left out of the invitation. But by the end of the story, everyone receives an invitation. The only people who were left out were the ones who made excuses and kept themselves out. But we all make excuses for not participating fully in God's banquet. Talk to your kids about excuses you feel keep getting in the way of your relationship with God. This is not about feeling guilty for the excuses we have made, but about the irresistible grace that keeps pulling us back and giving us another invitation.
