# **ADULT EDUCATION CLASS**

**Bible Study: A Fifth Gospel for Our Time?** 

Mondays November 9, November 16, November 23 1:00—2:00PM

Join us on zoom to study Isaiah, a biblical book that is perfect for the last months of 2020, capturing both our COVID moods and our dreams for a post-pandemic world! Scholars today think Isaiah is a stream of tradition rather than the work of one person, containing voices that are aristocratic and moralistic, dark and visionary, and liturgically hope-filled and hopeful all in one book. And early Christianity often referred to the book of Isaiah as a fifth gospel because it "describes all the mysteries of Christ and the church so clearly." So much later Christian imagery—the wolf dwelling with the lamb, the beating of swords into plowshares, the good news to the poor, the new heaven and new earth, the victory of God over the dark forces of the world, and more--comes out of this prophetic book. Over three weeks, we'll explore the ways in which this prophet touches the heights and depths of human experience as well as a creation renewed and restored.

**Rev. Dr. Susan De George** is the Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Hudson River and teaches religious studies at Pace University. She is also a lawyer. Susan enjoys playing guitar and flute, gardening, weaving, traveling reading and having interesting conversations with folks who really want to change the world.
