Over three Mondays, we will explore the book that theologian Walter Brueggemann says contains "a double utterance of judgment that contradicts denial and hope that overrides despair" and begin to understand why Nobel Prize winner Elie Wiesel held that Jeremiah's "determined quest for truth in times of falsehood..., his doubts, his tears, his yearning for meaning and silence... he offers us an example of behavior, not before or after, but during periods of pressure, stress, and peril." DEACONS

The Deacons' monthly meeting was on **February 24th**. Rachelle opened the meeting with a Prayer.

Shannon provided news that some of our youth may have been recently exposed to COVID while on a retreat hosted by Hope Church.

Peyton's roommates tested positive for COVID. So far Peyton has tested negative, but is quarantined.

We discussed that as of today, the church will still be remote; it's just not worth trying to be indoors with all of the distancing restrictions. We would only be able to have 40 people at an indoor service and we would still need to ZOOM to remote followers. We do have many people joining our services from all over the states, and even several nonmembers. The deacons will send out more detailed information so all members of the congregation understand what was involved in this very difficult decision. Shannon will provide us with the necessary information to pass on to our flocks.

We agreed that Deacons and our Elders will still be part of the service to read the Prayer and Scripture until further notice. Once we return to in-person service, we will be asked to help with the tasks required to keep us all safe (seating, temperature checks, or whatever is needed), but only if we feel safe doing this ourselves.

There was discussion of Deacon Procedures when meals were needed for families in our flocks. Deacons Julie Stein and Patty Dormer will be our liaisons to other deacons to set up an electronic Meal Sign Up. The deacon of the flock member in need would provide Julie and Patty with the required details (number of meals, duration, preferences, etc). Once set up, the link and other information would be sent to the WPC office for a mass mailing out to the congregation. That way anyone in the church has the opportunity to help out.

We shared news of our flocks as well as shared other concerns, needs, joys.

Ann White closed with an inspirational message, passed on to her by our beloved Beth Mason. This poem is written by Sheenagh Pugh

Sometimes things don't go, after all, from bad to worse. Some years, muscadel faces down frost; green thrives; the crops don't fail, sometimes a man aims high, and all goes well. George Frideric Handel's "Messiah" was first performed in Dublin on or about Easter Sunday, April 13, 1742. Handel had intended the "Messiah" to be an Easter oratorio, not a Christmas oratorio as we think of it.

The famous "Hallelujah" chorus appears at the end of Part II in the oratorio and serves to celebrate the resurrection and Ascension of Christ, not his birth.

By the stroke of circumstance, we will hear this great piece of music at the time of year that Handel had intended it for.
