### **People: Deliver us from evil.**

Leader: Subdue our selfish desires, and forbid us both arrogance in our small victories and hopelessness in our darknesses. Grant us a courage and hope found in a faith—not in earthly power, but in the redemptive love of our Risen Christ who leads us forth into a new kind of life. Grant us the boldness and openness of heart to move into healing relationships and rightly- directed anger and a world which would be the realm where God reigns.
