World Communion Sunday Make Your Connection with the Body of Christ

Connectionalism is especially important for Presbyterians. In our Book of Order we claim that we are a "connectional church." In other words, the individual church is part of a Presbytery (in our case, the Presbytery of Southern New England); the Presbytery is a part of a synod (the Synod of the Northeast); and churches, Presbyteries and synods are part of the national body, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA).

But the connection does not stop there. It goes on, as the first Sunday of this month reminds us. World Communion Sunday is a time to celebrate at the table of our Lord, and to recognize that we do so not alone. World Communion Sunday began at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania in 1933. The Rev. Hugh Thompson Kerr and his congregation sought to demonstrate the interconnectedness of Christian churches, regardless of denomination.

Holy Communion was the mechanism to symbolize this unity. In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America, adopted World-Wide Communion Sunday. Here at WPC all are welcome to the Lord's Table. We join other followers of Jesus Christ, gathered around the table around the world, in places we have never heard of, with names we may not be able to pronounce, yet children of God, called by Jesus to his table. We do not come alone—we are gathered together—we are connected.

We are not an isolated outpost in the world—but a part of the Church Universal, a part of the world-wide body of Christ. Take your place among the faithful on October 3.

WEPCO GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY

Joint worship service with St. Matthews October 17, 10 am

Join in a celebration of cooperation between St. Matthew's Episcopal and Wilton Presbyterian Church on **October 17 at 10 a.m.** This will be an outdoor worship experience (weather permitting) with some limited indoor seating.

We will celebrate the Golden Anniversary of our joint effort also known as WEPCO. It all started in the early 1960's when Dr. Eugene Carson Blake (Stated Clerk of the General Assembly and later became the chief executive of the World Council of Churches) preached at Wilton Presbyterian Church and shared a vision for ecumenical cooperation among major Protestant denomination that would lead to the union of the different groups. He and Episcopal Bishop Rev. Dr. James Pike joined efforts to develop the Consultation On Church Union, also known as COCU. It was also called the "Blake-Pike Proposal." That planted the seeds for the creation of a joint endeavor between the St. Matthew's Episcopal and Wilton Presbyterian congregations.

Wilton Presbyterian and St. Matthew's brought a lofty idea into practice. In 1971, the Wilton Episcopal Presbyterian Corporation (WEPCO) was formed and we embarked on a unique partnership with our Episcopal neighbors and friends. While the WEPCO complex is the physical manifestation of this partnership, its spiritual aspects run much deeper. Wilton Presbyterian Church and St. Matthew's are separate congregations with separate sanctuaries, but which uniquely share a common property and programming. There is common space between our churches that serves many purposes. It is more than an ecumenical experiment. It is cooperative and collaborative experience. It is a partnership. We are more than two congregations sharing program and space. Indeed, we are all sisters and brothers in Christ.

We are excited that Wi-ACT is able to be hold its Meal-Packaging Event once again! Help the Wilton Interfaith Action Committee (WI-ACT) feed many malnourished children for an entire year wherever in the world the need is greatest.

The packaging will be done at the **WEPCO Joint Church Complex** at **48 New Canaan Road**.

Please be aware that, for COVID safety precaution reasons, the event this year needs to be about half the size of prior year's events in terms of the number of volunteers on each shift. Please don't let that discourage you from volunteering if there's space on the shift you select when you sign up, but also please don't be disappointed if your desire to serve can't be accommodated this year. If that should happen, we hope that you will volunteer again in future years when hopefully COVID safeguards will no longer be necessary.

To insure safety for everyone, please note these specific COVID protocols for the event:

- All volunteers must be fully vaccinated and bring to the Event vaccination cards AND evidence of negative PCR test results within 72 hours before Oct. 23rd.
- Everyone will wear masks, the number of volunteers in each workspace (there will be three packaging floors this year, not just one) will be limited to 25 to 30, and the workspaces will be fully sanitized between shifts.
- Children under 12 unfortunately cannot volunteer this year; we will really miss them and are looking forward to their return next year.

Be sure to get your PCR test done (available at Wilton CVS, among other pharmacy locations) by **Wednesday Oct 20th** so that you have the results back in time.
