A Wee-Word from Dr. Weenink Renewed in the Spirit

Our worship theme, sermon series and stewardship emphasis focused, over that past few weeks, around the theme Renewed In The Spirit. One never ends the process of being Renewed In The Spirit. The process enables us, each, to be ENLIGHTENED BY RENEWED PERSPECTIVE. It provides a good context for us to enter into Advent and embrace the Christmas event.

No one knows the exact moment when Jesus was born; in fact, Christmas was not mentioned as a celebration until the fourth century. With the influence of a church leader named Ambrose, the date for Christmas was set at the Winter Solstice when, for an infinitesimal moment, time stands still, the darkness begins to decrease, light begins to increase, and we cross the bar between the encroaching darkness and witness the days beginning to lengthen again. It is not by accident that we celebrate the coming of God's light to the world during the dark days of winter, when night shrouds our departures to daily endeavors and descends before we complete them. It is the darkest time of the year, when the days are at their shortest and we are the hungriest for light.

Our use of candles with the advent wreath and on Christmas Eve. the lighting extravaganzas displayed upon homes and yards are all ways in which we seek pierce the darkness in a spirit of hopefulness - yes even resolve.

Herein is where we will find our inspiration – piercing the darkness in a spirit of hopefulness – yes, even resolve to be enlightened by renewed perspective.

- Instead of complaining about all the pressure we are under at our places of endeavor; think about those who have no place of endeavor to which they may go and be enlightened by renewed perspective.
- When you admiring wreaths adorning homes; say prayers for those who place wreaths on the graves of fallen heroes and be enlightened by renewed perspective.
- Instead of taking for granted all the things you have; take into account all that you have and be enlightened by renewed perspective.

RFALM

Soon, all active WPC members will receive an email from the church inviting them to set up their Realm account/profile.

Realm is a great resource for committees and service groups to maintain their communications, calendar events and shared files. If you are on a committee or service group at UPC, you will likely be asked to use Realm for its communications. Once you see all the benefits of using Realm for committee functions you will certainly appreciate the ways Realm can help WPC provide better ministry to help fulfill our Mission.

A RMD CAN BE A REMEDY

If you're required to take a minimum distribution from your IRA, it is often referred to as a RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) You have the option to make that distribution tax free by directing it to the charity of your choice. Such distributions can be a convenient way to support the church, meet tax requirements for IRAs and get a bit of a tax break.

This is a very sensible option for many of us at Wilton Presbyterian Church. This provision (now permanent) provides an exclusion from gross income for certain distributions from an individual retirement account (traditional or Roth), which would otherwise be considered taxable income.

If you have saved tax-deferred income in an IRA and must begin taking required minimum distributions from that account(s) at age 70½, you'll pay income tax on that amount. By making a gift to charity from that IRA in an amount equal to or more than the required minimum distribution for that year, you can accomplish your charitable goals and reduce your tax liability.

Please note the following requirements:

- You must be 70½ years of age
- * Tax benefits apply to gifts up to \$100,000 per year
- * The amount must be in the form of an outright gift.

In order for the amount transferred from your IRA to Wilton Presbyterian Church to be a qualified charitable distribution, current rules stipulate that the funds be transferred directly from the plan administrator of your IRA to Wilton Presbyterian Church. You are required to contact the plan administrator to request the transfer.

Donors should consult their tax advisors about charitable distributions from an IRA and the advisability of making such contributions.

YEAR-END GIFTS

For many of us, the end of the year is a time for reflection. It is a time to review our accomplishments and re-examine our spiritual, personal, and professional lives. Did we use the year wisely in service to others? Did we use the time to strengthen our faith and commitment to God? Did we become better stewards, mothers, fathers, grandparents and employees?

For others, the end of the year marks a shift toward more futuristic thinking. Year-end giving offers a wonderful opportunity to plant seeds for the future. Such gifts not only aid the church, they are also an expression of deepening gratitude at a time of year when we focus our attention on God's great gift of Jesus Christ. A number of these gifts are made for special designated purposes, while others suggest, "find a useful place." You can make such gifts conventionally through checks or cash, and there are digital options available to you through Realm and the church website. Year-end gifts can be in forms other than cash. Stocks, bonds or other securities are another easy option. Thank you for your generous support and the stewardship it expresses.

SESSION

We hope that you have all seen and are enjoying our ad on the Good Morning Wilton website. Session has voted to continue this ad throughout the holiday seasons. In addition, Heather Borden-Herve, editor of GMW, will be reaching out to each of Wilton's places of worship to present a broader campus of places to worship during the holiday seasons. So, log into Good Morning Wilton every day and sometime over the next couple of months you will see a feature on WPC, highlighting our church and our Advent services. We all thank Bryan Campbell for championing this exciting opportunity for all of us to welcome new neighbors to WPC.

Beginning around the first of November, we will begin seeing work being done around our complex to install a campus security system. WEPCO is the recipient of a \$48,400 grant from the State of Connecticut that was offered to non-profit organizations they determined are "at heightened risk of being the target of terrorist attack, hate crimes or any violent act." Included in the installation will be 16 surveillance cameras both inside and outside our buildings, a software platform and PC for recording the video, four mobile panic alarms tied to the vendor's central station and the Wilton police department and a new electronic door lock on the main door, including wireless card access and up to 50 key cards.

Per Capita

What is Per Capita? Fair question. Let's attempt to answer it.

Per capita is the mechanism for funding the higher governing bodies of the church: Presbyteries, Synods and the General Assembly and their mission and administration When presbyteries, synods, and the General Assembly meet, they are conducting the legislative and judicial business of the church and incur necessary expenses. There are also some necessary administrative expenses involved which enable these ecclesiastical, legislative, and judicial functions to be performed. It has been part of our ecclesiastical funding history for over 150 years.

The whole church shares in these expenses since everyone who is listed on the membership roll shares in the benefits of this system of church government. Per capita provides for the financial participation of all local churches as part of a connectional and representative church, thus providing for unity and mutual responsibility within the church.

The 2022 Per Capita Apportionment (per – person listed on the WPC membership roll:

General Assembly	\$ 8.95
Synod of the Northeast	\$ 4.10
Presbytery of Southern New England	\$37.00
Total	\$50.05

Per capita, in any given year, is based on the number of members within churches as reported on December 31, in the previous year.

Every member is invited to contribute their apportionment to help offset this essential ecclesiastical expense. Please note "per capita" when you make your contribution.
