Old Testament Isaiah 58

They're busy, busy, busy at worship, and love studying all about me. To all appearances they're a nation of right-living people—law-abiding, God-honoring. They ask me, 'What's the right thing to do?' and love having me on their side. But they also complain,

'Why do we fast and you don't look our way?

Why do we humble ourselves and you don't even notice?'
