OUTREACH REPORT

FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH REPORT

- 1. The United Methodist Women will be holding their Annual Fall Rummage Sale on Friday and Saturday October 5th and 6th. Congregants can bring in their donations From Sunday, September 30th through Thursday, October 4th. Sue Malinowski, Adrienne Melnyk, and Candy Vesce are organizers of this event.
- 2. On September 15th, the UMW will be sponsoring a dinner to raise funds for the next Youth Mission Trip.
- 3, The next UMM breakfast will be held on Saturday, September 8th from 8 to 10 A.M. Come on out and enjoy an outstanding breakfast and the UMW will be holding a sale of mums at the same time as the breakfast.. You don't want to miss this golden opportunity to enjoy a great top-notch breakfast, buy some new fall flowers, and enjoy the company of Christian friends. The profits will be donated to Church Property Expenses.and the sale of flowers will be given to UMW Missions
- 4. There are several other events during the fall of the year. They are as follows: 1) Food collection for the Hope Center and Jackson Baptist Church on Sunday, September 9th. Congregants that attend the Contemporary Service should place their donations on the table in the Family Life Center and congregants that attend the Traditional Service should place their donations in the coatroom next to the Narthex. Personal hygiene items needed are soap, shampoo, baby diapers and baby wipes. 2) During the beginning of November the UMW will hold their annual Holly Berry Bazaar in the Family Life Center. Donations of books and holiday items can be made to an activity which earns a lot of money for the UMW. Jane Laub is the organizer of this event. 3) During the month of November, Kathy Newsome will hold the Annual Christmas Tree collection of children's hats, mittens, pajamas, etc that are donated to the Hope Center, 4) Harvest Home Sunday will be held on Thanksgiving Sunday with the objective of filling needy peoples' pantries with foodstuffs for the weekend of Thanksgiving, 5) During the month of December,

there will be a collection of fruit to make fruit baskets for our homebound members. Dianna Correll is the chairperson of this activity, and 6) a collection of toys and gift cards will be made to provide Christmas gifts for children that are needy to provide them with a "Christmas." The collection will be taken to the Hope Center for distribution.

HOPE CENTER REPORT

- 1) Hope Center volunteers will be working at the Olde Time Antiques, Crafts, & Collectibles Faire on Saturday, September 1, 2018 from 9 A.M. to 4 P.M. at the Hadley Street Parking Garage in Downtown Tomd River.
- 2) The Hope Center Chef's Night will be held on Monday, October 22, 2018 from 6 to 9 P.M. at the Eagle Ridge Golf Club.
- 3) Operation BBQ will be held on Saturday November 3, 2018 from 12 to 3 P.M. in the parking lot of the Presbyterian Church in Toms River. Volunteers are needed to man a project that prepares up to a thousand meals. Many can be taken home.
- 4) Statistics for the Hope Center's distribution of funds for the month of June, 2018: 1) 48 households were served at an expenditure of \$3,598.42; 2) Emergency shelter was provided for 42 nights at the cost of \$2830.00; 3) 5 families were helped with utilities at the cost of \$280.42; 4) Gas vouchers/transport was provided for 5 families at the cost of \$93.00; 5) 8 households were provided with Shop-Rite cards at a cost of \$175.00; 6) 3 families were given miscellaneous gift cards that totaled \$220.00; and 7) 24, 398 pounds of food was distributed.
- 5) The Hope Center sends their appreciation to FUMCTR for the monthly donations of food and personal hygiene items and also for other donations that help them expand their program.
