# **OUTREACH REPORT**

### FIRST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH REPORT

1. The big event for the month of October is the UMW Rummage Sale. Remember to start bringing in your donations on Sunday, September 30 from 10:30 A.M. to 2 P.M. On Monday, donations will be accepted from 8:30 A.M. to 9 P.M. On Tuesday, donations may be dropped off from 9 A.M. to 6 P.M. The deadline for donations to be dropped off is Thursday at 2 P.M. Friday is "Rummage Sale Day---2018" from 10 A.M. to 6 P.M. Saturday is \$4 Bag Sale Day from 10 A.M. to 1 P.M. Cleanup begins at 1 P.M.

2. Our monthly food collection during the month of October will be held on Sunday, October 14th. Please donate food items and personal hygiene items such as bars of soap, shampoo, deodorant, baby diapers, and baby wipes. Congregants that attend the Contemporary Service should place their donations on the table located in the Family Life Center. Congregants that attend the Traditional Service should place their donations in the coatroom next to the Narthex.

3. Remember that the Paula Brown Soup Kitchen is open every third and fourth Tuesday of the month. During the month of August the third week kitchen served 46 people at no cost. The fourth week kitchen served 42 people at the cost of \$33.36. Leftovers were given to Harbor House. Our Soup Kitchens are very important in helping to feed needy families in Ocean County. Always remember to sign up to donate needed ingredients to make the meals for each soup kitchen. Members of the Paula Brown Soup Kitchen need your help!

4. Remember the beneficiary of our Fourth Quarter Mission Giving is the United Methodist Homes. Please give generously to a loving ministry of our church. The money makes sure that no resident is ever released from the homes due to lack of funds.

#### HOPE CENTER

1. They sold jewelry at the Olde Time Antiques, Craft, and Collectibles Faire at the Hadley Street Parking Garage in Downtown Toms River on September 1, 2018. They are sponsoring their 8th Annual Feast of Hope from 6 to 9 P.M. on Monday evening, October 22 at the Eagle Ridge Golf Club., and they will sponsor an "Operation BBQ" on Saturday, November 3, from 12 to 3 P.M. Volunteers are needed to man different stations of the BBQ. If interested, in volunteering, please see Dave Correll. They will be making up to a thousand meals on November 3. Meals can also be taken home.

2. Food Pantry needs at the Hope Center are as follows: 1) Canned Fruit, Jelly, Juice, Cereal, Peanut Butter, Soup, and prepared meals such as Dinty Moore Beef Stew. At the present time, blankets are a need.

3. The Hope Center's July, 2018 Statistics are as follows: 1) Households served 49 at \$3074.00; 2) Emergency Shelter- 42 nights at \$2,780.00, 4); Utilities- 3 families at \$125.00; 5) Gas Vouchers/Transport- \$169.00; 6) ShopRite cards- 5 households at \$155.00; 7) Miscellaneous Gift Cards- 3 households at \$250.00; 8) 446 families served 19,644 pounds of food.

4. The Hope Center is beginning a tutoring program at the Walnut Street Elementary School. If you want to volunteer to help tutor, please sign one of the sheets that adorn several tables in our church.

The Fall is a great time to arrange a gift to the permanent endowment fund since we just celebrated the 20th Anniversary of the Permanent Endowment Fund's founding. Each year the Heritage Society Plaque will be updated and could include your name. And your gift could be made now or in the future such as including it in your Will or as a portion of a life insurance policy. Or it can be gift made with a current donation such as cash or stock. Some will find the Charitable Gift Annuity where the donor receives income for their lifetime will be the most beneficial method.
