Dear members and friends,

For the last two weeks I have been enjoying watching the Summer Olympics in Rio. As the old ABC Wide World of Sports announcer used to say, I saw the thrill of victory and the agony of defeat. But while our attention was focused on those amazing athletes, our neighbors in Louisiana were struggling just to survive terrible flooding.

As I saw the scenes of families returning to homes ruined by flood waters, I was reminded of our youth mission trip in 2011 to New Orleans helping rebuild homes destroyed by hurricane Katrina. We heard the same kinds of stories – how flood waters caused similar destruction to people's homes and lives. And we witnessed the resilience of people rebuilding.

Whenever and wherever there are disasters, Presbyterians have always responded. Even now, the donations we collected on Easter (One Great Hour of Sharing) are at work bringing relief. The Presbyterian Church (USA) has dispatched its National Response Team. Much more will follow in the weeks and month to come. And we will be there long after the spotlight shifts to the next major tragedy.

For the last several years, our presbytery has had a special relationship with the presbytery of West Virginia. Twice a year, we send teams for a week-long mission trip to help rebuild homes. The next trip is scheduled for this September 18 – 24. The deadline to respond is August 31.

I would encourage you to consider going. As our youth have found, these trips will reward you with a powerful experience and an opportunity to make a difference. Details are below.
