

JAMES ISLAND OUTREACH UPDATE. Saturday, April 11th was a busy morning distributing food to 81 clients. There were eight new clients from our service area (James Island and Folly Beach), eight from out of our service area, and the remaining were our existing clients. All received food.

There were about five cars already in line at 8:00, and about 25-30 in line by 9:15. We anticipate the same response next Saturday. We will need additional volunteer help for traffic control and moving the food on Saturday, April 18th.

We also need a couple of volunteers during the week to restock pantry and repack bags. We are guessing we'll need 40-50 bags packed.

We currently are in need of the following:

Jelly, Juice, Jiffy Mix, Pancake Mix, Saltine Crackers, Cereal.

These are our current needs to be able to provide food distribution to those in need during these uncertain times.

Anyone who can volunteer on Saturday, April 18th, or during the week to restock and pack bags, please call Scott Graule (843-270-8384). All food donations can be dropped off at the church and they will be delivered to JIO.

We wanted to take this opportunity to share with our community of faith all of the amazing things that have been happening while we've been away...

Harbor View is still working and growing while we have all been at home. We've had a huge response to our Facebook Live services. Our attendance for the live portion has averaged 100 families, but our views have been 800 to 1500. We are truly Sharing God's love with all.

In addition to this exciting news, and in response to several security concerns that we have been struggling with over the past several years, we have been beefing up security in the building. After forming a committee to explore avenues to address internal and external security issues, we have installed CCTV cameras and new door locks. These additions will provide protection for both our daycare and our congregation. Once everything is installed, the company providing the new security equipment will offer training on how to best utilize what's been installed.

In order to provide all of this, we were required to add reliable WiFi to the building, and it is working beautifully! Since we were pricing all of this, we added in digital signage and screens to see if we could possibly make those upgrades as well. The cost for the screens was minimal compared to the rest of the quote, so your session voted to go ahead and do all of the work. This decision was made just prior to the shutdown, so we have been able to get this work done during this downtime.

Many of you have signed up for [RightNow Media](#), and this service will continue to be a

part of our technology upgrade. Our Sunday School classrooms will all have screens and the ability to show these videos and others right in the classrooms.

Finally, once things return to our normal 9:30 am Sunday schedule, due to these additions, we will be able to continue showing our Sunday morning services online with the new camera that is being installed in the sanctuary. So, if you are unable to make it to church, everyone will be able to view the service live! It will be on the screen in the nursery as well so that the nursery workers can see what's happening in the sanctuary. We are excited to have the ability to continue reaching the larger audience that this pandemic has created, but, most importantly, we look forward to worshipping together, in person, as soon as we are able.

Greetings everyone!

I hope that even though so many things have changed in the past several weeks, and many of those changes have been challenging at best, that some of that change has brought an opportunity to spend time with family, in prayer, and God in great and meaningful ways.

In the midst of all that is going on in our culture, our country and our world, our Session folks have established a way to reach out to others for whom these changes may be causing serious and life changing problems.

It is likely that most of us have heard about the government's stimulus package that will result in many Americans receiving funds from our government. In response to the current needs, the Session has voted to invite the congregation to contribute any percentage of the stimulus funds that we might receive to the HVPC Pastor's Discretionary Fund. Once received, this fund will be used to meet requests for financial assistance from HVPC members or others that HVPC members may know who are currently in need.

A team of three elders, with the pastor, will be responsible for receiving and reviewing each request for funds. The goal here is to help as many people as we can to move through this difficult time in the best way possible by sharing the love and blessings of God with any and all who are in need.

The Session will notify everyone, once funds are received, that the account is available to any and all who might benefit from it. As this is the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, all requests should be sent via email, phone or text to Rusty. Email: pastor@harborviewpc.org. Phone: (864) 399-2288. I will immediately pass each request to the review team, who will in turn prayerfully address the request as quickly as possible.

We ask that any donations to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund be over and above the donations and pledges that we have made to the mission and ministry at HVPC. We want to be sure that we are able to support each other and our community both in this way, and in every way that God calls us to.

Again, this is an opportunity to share with each other the blessings that have been shared with us. All donations and dispersals of funds will of course always remain anonymous. Please continue to be safe and in prayer for our community and our country in this time of tremendous challenge. I continue to hear story after story of how all of you are reaching out to those in need. Your gifts of meals, time, hand-written cards, prayer, and reaching out are bolstering the spirit of so many and giving hope to us all!
