



CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

As was announced on Sunday, January 10, 2021, a Congregational Meeting will be held on **Sunday, January 31, 2021**, following the worship service. Due to Covid-19, it will be a virtual meeting that will include receiving the 2021 budget approved by the Session, any changes in the Call of the Minister, approving the salary of the Pastor, and finalization of the vote on the proposed slate of elders. Information about this will be sent out by email. Members will be able to indicate their approval of the slate of elders, propose a nomination from the floor, and ask questions about the budget. A paper ballot will be available upon request.

This is very different from our traditional Congregational Meeting where we can all gather in person and requires us to be creative in holding this meeting in a different way. Normally the proposed new elders would be introduced during a preceding worship service, and everyone would be able to see them and talk with them. To help our members who have not had the pleasure of meeting them, each one has provided a brief biography to help get to know them. Here is the proposed slate of elders for the Class of 2023:

Alixanna Benson: "A lifelong Presbyterian, I have been a member of HVPC since 2008, along with my husband, Chris, and our three daughters: Anna Sofia (16), Lula Kate (15), and Eva Elizabeth (13). This is very simple (see the directions in the newsletter), but, if possible, please consider adding the extra few dollars for processing as this is another expense for the church.

In the meantime, we want to continue to do God's work in the many ways that we are able.
