OVERVIEW OF NAAC REGIONAL TRAINING INSTITUTES

A three-day immersion experience in the forming of disciples

Overall Goal of Institute: "To present a vision for the catechumenal process as both a rite of Christian initiation for adults and a means of forming disciples for baptismal living."

Objectives:

- 1. To provide a process in which participants experience the flow of the catechumenal process including the rites.
- 2. To provide opportunities in which the participants learn skills and techniques critical to the implementation of the process and the rites.
- 3. To invite participants to deepen their own faith life.
- 4. To challenge participants to explore the connection between good liturgy and good catechesis.
- 5. To deepen their understanding of the "conversion" journey to baptismal living.
- 6. To offer resources and support that will help renew the worship and faith life of congregations and their members (disciples).
