PASTOR'S PONDERINGS...

..for people like us ... in times like this...

“JESUS: The Model of the Godly Life”

Dear friends and followers @ New Life,

Back in the 1980's there was a retired chemical engineer in the congregation I helped develop in Huntsville, TX. His name was Ed. He went to Rice U. When it was free. He was raised a Methodist, but researched all the world's religions and concluded that Lutherans got it right and Lutherans got it best and then he married one. He cried when I moved to New Orleans at the behest of the bishop. He's a lamppost to me. We had many discussions of faith. Sometimes he was right and mostly I was wrong but our conversations were of God and we both benefitted. So, why bring old Ed up now in 2019? Well, there was this one thing he'd say over and over... "Pastor, everyone witnesses every day. Whatever we say and whatever we do is our witness to the world." A powerful thought, eh? So, I tried that out on the Confirmation Class a couple of weeks back. We were looking at the liturgy for Holy Communion and one of the closing prayers includes these words...

“Almighty God, you gave your Son both as a sacrifice for sin and a model of the Godly life. Enable us to receive him always with thanksgiving, and to conform our lives to his.”

I asked the students, “which would you rather be... a bank president or a bank robber?” They all chose bank president. Why? I asked. The stares I got were affirming. Then I asked, “would you rather be a pharmacist or a drug dealer?” A unanimous response... pharmacist. Why? Same stare. One last time, “would you rather be a car mechanic or a car thief?” Car mechanic. Pharmacist. Bank president. Even when I pointed out the others made way more money. “But, the others are against the law and you will end up in jail...” was their collective reply. It seems as though this batch of 7th and 8th graders have a sense of rootedness and posture of ethics many adults do not. Remember what old Ed said, “we witness every day.”

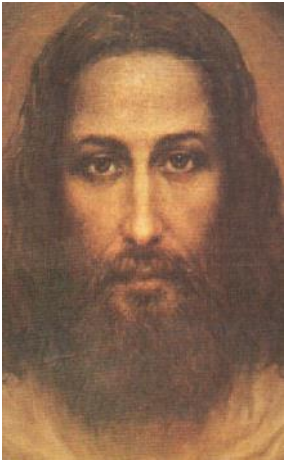
And here's the point... as saints and sinners we are *works in progress* rather than works of perfection. Trust grace! Always. Trust Jesus, the model of the Godly life...

And let me take this thought one step further... the old late 20th century theologian, Dr. Paul Tillich once made a comment that goes kind of like this... “*If Jesus was the only fully human being to walk the face of the earth, then the rest of us are SUB-human.*” He did not say this to speak unkindly of humanity; rather he said this as a way to reduce the anxiety that lives in the world when there are so many Christian leaders going around demanding that “*everyone be PERFECT like your heavenly father...*” And he concluded that remark by saying... “*our goal then is not to be perfect like God, but to be fully human like Christ!!!!*” Wouldn't the world be better if we all strived to be fully human as Jesus demonstrated?

Starting June 9, I will share a series of messages this Summer titled, “JESUS on JESUS.” You'll like it! Bear witness to your faith. Show up. Engage. Listen. Learn. Invite a friend.

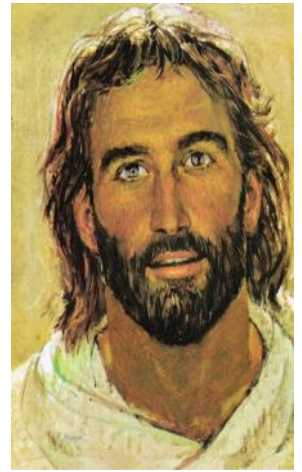

FROM TIME TO TIME

The church is called to tell the story of God and be a light to the world. The church is a “welcome” place and provides ways to grow in all aspects of faith and life. From time to time a one-time class, training or event needs to be scheduled. This Fall there will be opportunities and those who desire to be part can help pick the date(s). As you have need...



PRE-BAPTISMAL INSTRUCTION can be scheduled with the pastor at anytime prior to celebrating the Sacrament of Holy Baptism for adults, teens, toddlers or infants. Baptisms are schedule as part of the public worship of the congregation.

FIRST COMMUNION INSTRUCTION is offered to younger children both in the Fall and Spring of each calendar year. Reformation Sunday and Maundy Thursday of Holy Week are the celebration days. A 3-part instruction class is held with parents, children and the pastor. Adults can learn more about the sacraments in “The Path to New Life” class.



HOUSE BLESSINGS are offered via a request and conversation with the pastor. When a person or family acquires a new home, this ancient tradition of the church can be used as family and friends gather for a party including a litany of prayers and scripture to offer God’s blessing in each room of the house.

“GOING TO THE CHAPEL” is the name of the 2 hour workshop for those who are preparing for marriage. This workshop can be individualized for one couple or can be attended by 5– 10 couples. Examining the ‘5 C’s of a Christian Marriage” and “Stages of Marriage” are included. Remember to speak with the pastor before setting a date for the wedding!



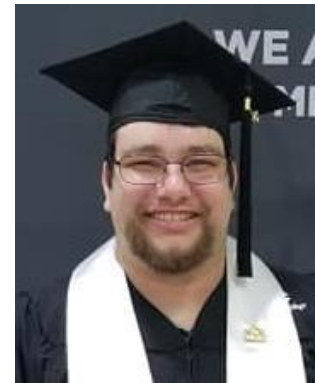

Hello, New Life Church family,

The Bible says in 1 Thessalonians, “give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.” So, I want to give as much thanks as I can to all those who have continually supported the Sunday School students and Youth Group throughout 2018-2019. We have finished my 3rd year together. Wow, that really is something. Thanks for all your support and encouragement throughout the year.

The men’s group was extremely generous in donating 70% of the Good Friday Fish Fry funds. They will go to appropriate places for Day Camp, Lutherhill summer camp and possibly to our Creation Care trip to Grand Canyon which is schedule for July 28 to August 3. Big thanks for Jenaro and Aimee for driving and participating. That being said, there are many more fundraisers we need to initiate. One creative solution is for you to hire a youth kid to clean up your yard or house or a similar venue. Please let me know if you would like to put them to work. They would like the chance to get their hands dirty (whether they know it or not).

I am asking you for your annual donations for Day Camp which starts in less than 2 weeks. Please take a post-it note from our display in the Narthex and know that your generosity is being put to good use.

The last 2 summers I have relied on certain families to house our Lutherhill staff; I am asking you to replace those families this year so that they can get a much deserved reprieve. Please let me know immediately if you are willing and able to do this. Day Camp is 1 week this year, again. I am thankful for Cheryl for going out of her way to cook breakfast and for others for volunteering and making donations, already. Our Day Camp runs from June 10-14 with the theme, “Wonder.”

Behind the scenes, I have been in contact with several local churches to see if we can combine our youth groups in various activities. Basically, I want our kids to go to other churches since their groups are bigger than ours. I am hoping that they will see familiar faces from school and possibly friends as well. Last

year, we were supposed to attend a lock-in at a local church, but alas, none of our kids were able to attend. I hope we will be able to round up our kids to help with local service projects or even for our church folk.

Next Spring, the face of our youth group will change drastically as all three of my students will be in their senior year and graduating in one year’s time. As a result, I implore the parents to bring your kids to church so that I teach them the Word of the Lord on any given Sunday. FAITH5 has been promoted throughout this year from Pastor to me to our various classes and families. It needs to keep being promoted since there is much room to grow. 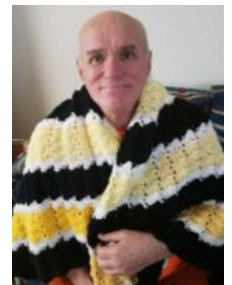

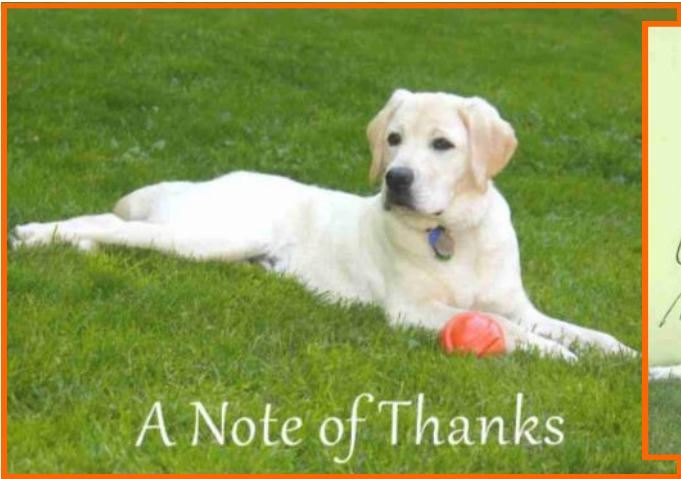

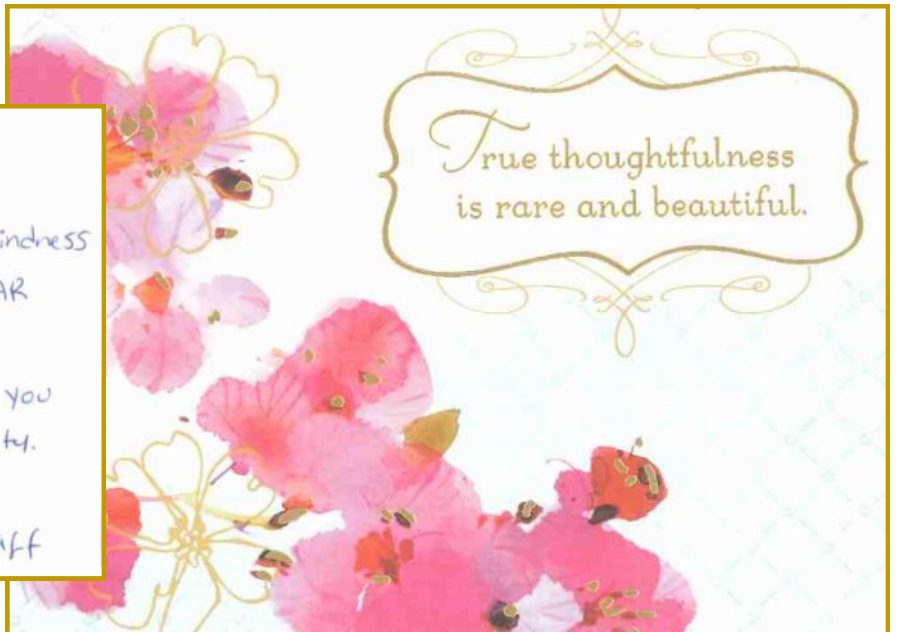

I'm sure that everyone is aware that summer has arrived. Now we can look forward to higher water and electric bills. Some of us will carry a sweater wherever we go, because many prefer to live in refrigerated conditions. To save electricity, you all know to watch your thermostat and turn off lights when they're not needed. Frankly, I wonder why my neighbors are so keen on illuminating the whole neighborhood all night. For water, most people know to watch for leaks and dripping faucets and don't let the water run in the sink or shower too long. Some people have roof gutters that transport the rainwater runoff into a cistern which they use for watering the gardens and beds. It is also possible to set large garbage bins under the places where most of the water is funneled off the roof. Keep the lid on when it's not raining or when it's full and fill it on rainy days. Then you can siphon it off with a hose or dip into it with a watering can. Even that is probably not enough in mid-summer. Most lawns really don't need to be watered, except occasionally during prolonged draught, or when newly sod. Also, during a draught, don't cut the lawn so often or so short. Planting native grass and plants that are draught tolerant also can save water. Mulch helps to hold in moisture as well as control weeds. Natural mulch is better for your plants and soil than dyed mulch and never heap mulch up around a tree trunk. If you let the water from the hot tap run until it gets hot, try saving it for watering plants or some other use. Do the same for warm water in the pipes in summer when you want cooler water. Let me know what you do to save water and electricity. I'll share your ideas next month.

Turtle Patrol started April 1st. Karen, Terry and MaryAnn are trekking 6.5-8 miles every Friday til mid-July looking for tracks. Eggs are collected and taken to a hatching barn in Corpus to help turtle mortality rates. So far, there have been several nests found (not by us though) and lots of "stranded" turtles have been found (alive & dead). If you are on the beach this summer, be sure to take all trash and "beach" items home. Even the broken stuff. Sea life cant tell the difference between food and plastic. And they get tangles in chairs, sand toys, etc. Keep it clean! If you spot a turtle, don't touch it! Call 1-866-TURTLE5. A trained team will come collect the eggs and monitor the turtle momma. Thanks!

Hurricane season is upon us. As coastal residents, we are wise to be as prepared as we can be. We encourage each and every one of you to become a "72 Hour Lutheran", a person who has enough supplies in their home to meet their household's basic needs for 72 hours.

Being prepared to take care of your own family allows you to then reach out and help others.

When you get home today, take a moment to make this a priority:

- Use this checklist for supplies
- Determine escape routes
- Make an evacuation plan for all pets
- Share one out of state emergency contact with all of your family and friends
- Call your church and be sure your information is correct
- Know the vulnerability of your home and the safest areas within it

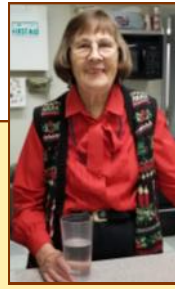

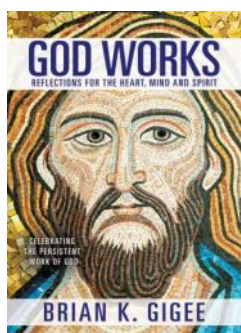

PRAYER CORNER



HOW TO PRAY for Kids

- Question:** What can I pray about?
Answer: ANYTHING! God wants you to talk to Him about everything in your life. Nothing is too big or too small to talk to God about.
- Question:** When and where should I pray?
Answer: ANYTIME and ANYWHERE! It doesn't matter where you are; you can always talk to God. He is always with you.
- Question:** How long should my prayer last?
Answer: You can pray for one second or for hours. God is always listening! He loves for you to talk to Him.
- Question:** Can I pray with my friends?
Answer: ABSOLUTELY! Praying with your friends will make your faith and your friendships stronger.
- Question:** Should I always fold my hands?
Answer: Folding your hands and closing your eyes may help you to concentrate on your prayer, but you don't have to. You can talk to God while riding your bike or just sitting quietly.
- Question:** Should I pray out loud?
Answer: God hears you whether you pray out loud or silently. Sometimes praying out loud helps you to stay focused on your prayer. Praying silently can be done wherever you are. God hears your prayers no matter how you say them!
