"WHEN ADVENT CALL US TO START OVER!"

Dear friends & followers @ New Life,

Lutherans and other liturgical churches celebrate Advent every year... it's when the church parament colors change from green to blue. Blue is the color or HOPE and Advent is a time of hope... a time not to just prepare for Christmas but a time to ask and answer a series of questions... What does it mean to embrace "new life?" It kind of leans into the question of the fundamentalists... "Are you saved?" Which always makes me ask... "Saved from what?" Saved from who?" Saved for what?" It's important to press this... Why? Well, because we are always saints and sinners... always sinners and saints... and when it comes to the 'saving' aspect of my life... I could get "saved" at the local Third Baptist Church of the Incarnate Intersection... but rob a bank the next day... losing my saved-ness in stealing the savings of others... See? It's the same with "new life"... we have one... because of the 'saving' nature of Jesus... but do we live it? Hopefully, with a 'do-over' each day!

Where Is Home?

George Carlin once described the point of baseball as, "... to run home – and be safe."

It's getting on toward Christmas, again.

In life, as well as baseball, the desire to run home, and be safe, can be strong. When we are confronting pain, loss or betrayal, we instinctively feel that if we can just hide away, the terrors won't be able to find us. Home is a warm place where we feel safe and secure. Home is filled with pleasant memories. Home is where we find the chimney that Santa uses to bring presents to all the good little girls and boys.

Of course, that perfect home is a myth. Home can also be painful. Disease can enter a home unbidden and carry off someone you love. Home can be where you are lied to and betrayed. Home can be where someone promises to be your partner and to always be there, but then leaves you alone and hurting.

Pain changes people. For some, the pain produces a hardness of spirit, like a callous – a response that I know all too well. Each betrayal, each violent word, each failure, each lost job, each lost child, each lost love adds layer upon layer of callous. And this process goes on and on, until one day you realize that most of your life is behind you, and the life you have now is largely defined by the things that you no longer have.

My middle daughter recently asked me, what I was going to do next. She suggested that I might want to retire and move home. But to tell the truth, I've spent so much time traveling around the country and world, that I've kind of lost track of where home is.

The thing is, because I traveled so much, I always thought less about the home I was leaving than the home I was on my way to: the next duty station, the next job, the next contact. Now, I have begun looking at my next home in a different way.

Jesus said that He was going to prepare a place for me – a permanent home that really will be perfect.

Seeing this ultimate home through faith is why the change that pain causes doesn't have to create hardness. It can also produce a warm, open heart. A friend from church told me recently that she was glad I was starting to open up again in spite of the ever-present risks. Of course, being open is a risk. God risked in Jesus.

Hurts will still come; we will still be betrayed and life will still be unfair at times. But now we aren't alone. Jesus is there taking the blows for us, shielding us from real harm.

But openness is also the only way to really live. If your heart isn't open you may make it from now until death with a minimum of upset or pain, but at what cost? Your callouses will have also caused you to miss out on the hope, joy and love that God had in store for you – and that, dear friend, is the real tragedy.

So, I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and that Christ will be at home with you no matter where you spend it.

Thanks to Karen Cheney, Becky Homerstad, Mary Ann Marcha, and Helen Beckman for picking up litter on E. Orange Street November 9. We picked up one tall kitchen bag of litter, about 1/3 bag of recyclables and 125 cigarette butts in 1 ½ hours. It seemed to be much less litter than usual. Maybe, we had help from the previous rain. If so, it means litter was washed into the gutter and out to sea. I hope it didn't include plastic bags, straws, and cigarette butts or I hope that people are just more careful about littering. Some

of the things we found were a spoon and two forks, \$1.19 in change that went into the WELCA Thank Offering box, all kinds of mini-litter, literally nuts and bolts, and a loofah that was used as show and tell in Sunday School. Our recycling bag included 6 water bottles. The use of reusable drink containers could have

prevented that.

A loofah is a gourd which can be used as a sponge when peeled and dried. Because of its rough texture, it is used to exfoliate the skin, but is not recommended by dermatologists. It looks like a huge cucumber and

grows on a vine that spreads rapidly and kills tomato and pepper plants with which it comes into contact. We found ours on the ground under a vine along the fence on the

north side of E. Orange.





As our local flora goes into the dormant stage, many of us are beginning to prune tree limbs and bushes and rake leaves. We are especially fortunate here in Pearland to have curbside yard waste pickup every week on the first garbage pickup day. Limbs need to be bundled and tied. Bundles should be 4 feet or less in length. Yard waste should be in clear, see through plastic bags and contain only yard waste and no other garbage. The ones I get are tinted green. If you have lawn service, be sure they have the correct bags. Everything in black bags is left for garbage pickup. Every week in Pearland, thousands of bags of yard waste go into the landfill, using up precious landfill space, because they are left curbside in opaque bags. Decaying yard

waste produces biogas, sometimes called landfill gas, which is about half methane and half carbon dioxide. Both are considered greenhouse gasses, but methane has 25 times the effect of CO2 and more dangerous to the environment and people. Because landfills are the third largest source of methane, environmental protection law requires the capture of methane to be burned off through flares or for fuel for producing electricity.

Our curbside collected yard waste goes to a commercial composter where it decomposes aerobically (with oxygen) as opposed to anaerobically (without oxygen) in a landfill. This produces more CO2 and much less methane.

After Christmas, remember to put your live tree outside for yard waste collection or take it to the Stella Roberts Recycle Center to be taken to the Gulf Coast for dune building. Obviously, nature recycles. You can, too.



1 *First Sunday of Advent* Lift up prayers of thanks and praise for this season of anticipation, remembrance and celebration of Jesus Christ — God's awesome gift of love and redemption for all humanity.

2 Pause each day to reflect prayerfully on the symbols, traditions and practices — ancient and new — that we see and experience throughout Advent and Christmas. Give thanks for everything that centers our attention on the good news of Jesus Christ, deepens our faith as loved and redeemed children of God, and inspires and guides our baptismal journey.

- 3 Today has become known as Giving Tuesday, a day for encouraging generosity and charitable giving. Pray that the Spirit will always inspire us to be generous with our resources, money, gifts and time for the sake of our neighbors in need.
- 4 Pray that we awake each day, putting on Jesus Christ and shining as a light in the world, a brilliant light that shines with good news, love, justice, compassion and peace.
- 5 Remember in prayer Augusta Victoria Hospital (AVH) and the other hospitals in East Jerusalem. AVH is owned and operated by the Lutheran World Federation and supported by several of its member churches, including the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Pray that our government will restore funding vital to the safe and effective operation of the East Jerusalem hospitals as soon as possible so that patients especially children, who are particularly at risk will continue to receive the treatment and care they need.
- 6 Give thanks for the young people who have served or are currently serving as Young Adults in Global Mission, working alongside our global companions to share the gospel, grow the church, care for people in need and strengthen communities in the name of Christ. Pray that these young adults will inspire others to respond to God's call to ministry and service locally and globally.
- 7 When you see an Advent wreath, reflect on the circle of evergreen branches and give thanks for the gift of eternal life we have in Jesus Christ the promised Messiah, born for the sake of the world.
- 8 Pray for clarity and faith in the lifelong baptismal journey for which the Holy Spirit calls, renews and equips us a journey for the sake of the world.
- 9 The "Declaration of the ELCA to People of African Descent" is a public apology offered by our church in the context of the quadricentennial remembrance of slavery in this country. With faith in God's forgiveness and mercy, pray that we will be unconflicted in our repentance, committed to understanding injustice and racism, and bold and persistent in working to end racism and white supremacy wherever they exist, including in the church. 10 Give thanks that we are freed by our faith to serve our neighbor and affect change in our communities, nation and world change that is grounded in the gospel and God's vision of justice, compassion, healing and peace for all people.
- 11 Pray that God's righteousness, justice, peace and compassion for the poor and oppressed will flourish in the world, and that we will be bold and persistent in doing God's work together.
- 12 Remember in prayer people, especially women and children, who live in refugee camps and immigration detention centers. Pray that they will soon return home or move to a community or country where they are welcome and safe, able to reunite with family and reestablish their lives. Give thanks for our church's and Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service's commitment to advocate and care for refugees and immigrants everywhere.
- 13 Remembering that we have been welcomed without hesitation into the body of Christ, pray that we will exercise, without judgment or partiality, grace and hospitality toward our neighbors friends, antagonists and strangers alike.
- 14 Give thanks to God for the gifts, service and ministry of women as we celebrate 50 years of Lutheran women being ordained in the United States, 40 years of women of color being ordained and 10 years of LGBTQIA+ individuals being able to serve freely.
- 15 Give thanks for being reminded and reassured through the word of God, the sacraments and the witness of one another that Jesus is the promised Messiah, our savior, teacher, life and hope.

16 Pray for ELCA missionaries and young people serving in the Young Adults in Global Mission program who are separated from their families and home congregations during the holidays yet celebrate the good news and gift of Jesus Christ with our companion churches and brothers and sisters in Christ around the world.

17 Pray that wherever the weather turns cold and damp, all people will have the warmth and safety of shelter, and that where shelter is absent or difficult to find, the love and generosity of God dwelling in us will move us to create and open shelters in our congregations, community spaces and homes.

18 Give thanks for ELCA Good Gifts, an opportunity to support ELCA ministries and programs in nearly 80 countries around the world, including the United States. These funds and gifts support work being carried out by our congregations, companion churches and ecumenical partners.

19 Over 47,000 people in the United States died by suicide in 2017, and there were approximately 1.4 million suicide attempts. Pray for hope, relief from suffering and skilled, compassionate care for people who struggle with loneliness, isolation and depression, especially during the holidays. Ask that the Spirit will move us to see and respond to the people around us and to engage in and support suicide-prevention efforts such as the work of the Suicide Prevention Ministry, an independent Lutheran organization.

20 Give thanks and praise to God, who lifts up those bowed down and oppressed, watches over strangers and sets free the bound and imprisoned.

21 Remember in prayer the many people who work and serve during the holidays, including first responders, care providers, law enforcement, medical personnel, pilots and attendants, truck drivers, men and women serving in the military, seafarers, social service staff, and people serving in stores, restaurants and hotels.

22 In the story of Mary, Joseph and the humble birth of Jesus, we sense God's love for humanity and God's understanding of the diverse contexts in which we live. Praise God for loving us as we are and for reaching into the world in ways that we can relate to, understand and embrace.

23 Ask that we will be strengthened and inspired by the Holy Spirit for sharing the story of God's love and mercy — the story of Jesus — in today's world and culture.

24 Christmas Eve What draws you to Jesus? What are you looking for in God's promises? Give thanks to God for revealing to us through Jesus Christ the gifts of fullness of life and the one true light that illuminates God's ways and truth.

25 *Christmas Day* Join with our sisters and brothers around the world and with all creation in lifting up prayers and songs of praise and thanksgiving for God's gift of love and life, manifested in the birth of Jesus Christ <u>—</u> a light in the darkness that cannot be overcome.

26 "Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things." Pray for enthusiasm and courage in spreading the good news of Jesus Christ through our words and actions each day.

27 Remember in prayer people who struggle to meet the costs of living, students and seminarians graduating with long-term student loans, and people experiencing ongoing or unexpected medical expenses. Ask God to help us exercise understanding, empathy and generosity in our support and care for people struggling with financial debts and needs.

28 Pray that the good news, joy and faith that live in us will not diminish with the passing of the holidays and special celebrations but will grow deeper and pervade every aspect of our life.

29 Reflect on Mary and Joseph fleeing one country for another with the baby Jesus; lift up in prayer all people who suffer injustice and persecution and have become refugees and immigrants seeking safety and acceptance. 30 Pray that God will bless the experiences of college and university students participating in J-term courses and service-learning experiences, and that these will enrich their faith, knowledge, wisdom and discernment of vocation.



31 On the threshold of a new year, ask that the Spirit will instill in us a sense of time and life that is unrushed, observant and appreciative of the people, community, creation and gifts given by God for our sustenance, use, enjoyment and sharing.
