PASTOR'S PONDERINGS...

...for people like us...

... in times like this...

“THE CHURCH IN DIASPORA!”

Dear friends & followers @ New Life,

Diaspora (*pronounced* DEE-ASP-OR-UH). Now there's a word you don't hear every day! In fact, it's sort of an oxymoron because the term 'diaspora' means 'to be dispersed' as is usually connected to the stories of the Old Testament when the Israelites were conquered and taken into captivity in a foreign land. They weren't where they were supposed to be. They had been dispersed from the 'promised land' and could hardly wait to get back home. God seemed to be behind all this and had a plan for Israel's repentance and taking a big step in re-rooting their faithfulness as deep as one's roots can go. Some folks say the Hebrew people are still in diaspora as there are faithful Jews all over the world and ironically there are more Jews living in New York City than there are in current day Israel.

Sound familiar? A little. We may be experiencing a different kind of dispersion. Rather than being led off to a foreign land by a victorious villain right, we have been sequestered to our homes by a virus we cannot see. Strange indeed. The church is always the Body of Christ to be sent out into the world with a message that is global and never a movement to be shut out from meeting together in assembly. Like our Jewish friends, rather than being a people scattered, assaulted, and embedded within other nations we are a people now placed into solitude with only a means of ZOOM meetings or facetime or Facebook Live as a way of being together. This won't last... but it will last a while and we need to take comfort in Jesus' words that where two or more are gathered in his name, he is in our midst.

So, this is an odd post attached to an odd word. It's the '*whirled*' we have now. We are dispersed but we still are the church! I miss you. I miss being together week to week and day to day... and getting more accomplished as a body than any of us can do on our own. How are you? Never before have we lived like this and never before have we had conversations like this... to stay 6 feet apart or more and washing our hands after we touch something. I don't even know who will be reading these words. Maybe more than last Christmas. Maybe less. Only God knows and so we trust that God knows we will get through this. The church isn't going away. WE are the church and we will just be stronger and better at being the church in this time and place. After all, this is 'our watch' and God's Spirit is calling each and everyone of us to a faithfulness than perhaps none of us have ever known.

Why? WE are ROOTED in the Word of God! Why? WE are REFRESHED in the Spirit as we continue to pray and read and talk our faith together so that we are better at REACHING into the neighborhood and the world... which is something NEW LIFE Church does pretty well. We're a bit dispersed for now, but our return to gathering face to face will come like Easter... with enough joy for each and every one of us! There really is no such thing as "the Church in diaspora" The Church is where WE ARE... in this corner of God's Kingdom attending to the work we need to do.

1 Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others of the Rocky Mountain Synod gathering online for a **digital synod assembly**. Pray that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an ever-changing world.

2 There are more than 100 Asian congregations and ministries in the ELCA. We remember in our prayers these congregations, ELCA Asian and Pacific Islander Ministries and the Association of Asian and Pacific Islanders, and ask

God to bless their work with distinct, unique groups and communities as part of a common yet diverse Asian community.

3 Jesus is our Savior, guide and shepherd, whom we have faith in and trust with leading us through life in this world and to a new life — life eternal — that we could not have imagined or created on our own. Praise God!

4 Give thanks for the service and witness of U.S.-based mission personnel and of young adults serving in the Young Adults in Global Mission program, who have been brought home from their work with global companions due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Pray for their physical and spiritual health and that they will continue to respond to God's call to serve in our church, our congregations, related organizations and society.

5 Ask God to help us have faith in how God leads, comforts, protects, nourishes and loves us all the days of our life.

6 Pray that we will be guided by the spirit, manner and example of Jesus to be humble and gracious in our faith, service and daily lives.

7 Ask God to help us endure the risks and difficulties of sharing the good news of Jesus Christ, doing good, working for justice and serving our neighbors in need.

- 17** The love of God and the Spirit of truth dwell within us and prevail in our daily lives. Pray that with this knowledge and inspiration, we will feel encouraged to follow the commandments and ways of God and to exemplify love, truth, mercy and service in the world.
- 18** Thank God for our special relationship with the Reformed Church in America, a full communion partner with the ELCA since 1997; pray for the church, its diverse ministries and its members and leaders; and pray that together we will find mutual support, new partnerships and new resources for the work of sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor.
