Pastor's Pen: The Adventure of Thanksgiving

One small but significant part of American Thanksgiving history and lore is that of immigrant Europeans, some from England. They risked life, limb, goods and reputation to cross an ocean to inhabit a land new to them. They had choices. Some of them were Separatists, unwilling to quietly go along when forced to do and believe as their government decreed. What to do? Comply and behave? Or risk leaving comforts and safety of their homeland, take a treacherous ocean journey, and become pilgrims and strangers in a new land?

Our native land is America. Yet it is a new world and we remain pilgrims and strangers. The wilderness is that of information and technology to communicate instantly, whether it's the birth of a baby or the latest act of terrorism. It takes courage and faith to live in today's world. Early generations of Americans pushed out the native peoples, ignoring their rights and plights and murdering some. Today, in our world, we are called to follow Jesus, not to push out, but to receive other people with their life needs, darkness and storms. Loving others for the sake of their life and well-being can lead to risking life, possessions and reputation --just ask Jesus.

And while you're at it, ask John Howland, a passenger on the Mayflower. On that voyage, the ship was caught in a great, dangerous storm. In the rolling waves, people got seasick. When the storm was at its worst, people had to stay below, cramped and in close quarters. There came to be quite a stench from seasickness.

One night, John Howland decided to risk going topside to get some fresh air. Once outside, a wave knocked the ship hard and Howland flew overboard into the dark, icy Atlantic. As he fell, his hand brushed against a rope trailing behind the Mayflower. He grabbed it and hung on for dear life. Through the storm's noise, a sailor heard his feeble cries for help. Sailors hoisted him to safety. He might have died of hypothermia in less than fifteen minutes, yet he lived to tell it. For him, the smell of fresh air was worth the risk, and God preserved his life in the midst of the danger.

The sailors hearing his cries could have played it safe and let him drown. But they chose not to. They risked their lives, and did whatever was necessary. John's life was forever changed. John Howland had a heart of thanks all the rest his life.

Though less dramatic, you have reasons to have a heart of thanks. Other people are barely hanging on in life's storms. Do you hear their feeble cries? What risks of love can you take for the sake of their life and well-being? If you wonder if such risks for others is worth the danger and trouble, well, --just ask Jesus. He risked--and lost--everything for the sake of the whole world (including us). As God, he crossed a treacherous ocean of human sin to establish a new colony of life for us. On the Cross he sailed into death for our salvation and lived to tell about it, for God hoisted him to life from the grave. Let us give thanks that Jesus did not play it safe.

New Life Lutheran Church Council Resolution to Return to In-Person Worship Services



The Council of New Life Lutheran in Pearland hereby resolves that it will resume in-person worship as of October 11, 2020 for both 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m..

Consistent with our calling to love and care for one another and for the health of our neighbors, any person attending in-person worship must wear a mask and maintain physical distancing. Weekly reservations for attendance are required using our RSVP link form.

Livestreaming of both worships will continue. Those who are ill, have tested positive for COVID-19, or who are in vulnerable populations should refrain from attending in-person worship. Persons exposed to COVID-19, or who have previously tested positive for COVID-19, must refrain from attending in-person worship until at least two weeks after they have tested negative for the presence of the virus.

Persons who choose to attend in-person worship agree to inform the church promptly if they learn they have been exposed to COVID-19. Notice of COVID-19 exposure should be made by calling Pastor Bill at 713-614-7561 and should inform us of the relevant date(s) of in-person attendance.

The church will then make appropriate, anonymous notifications to others who may have been in attendance on the same date, so they may take appropriate steps to protect their health and safety. The church office will also notify public health authorities and will assist them in any efforts to undertake contact tracing.

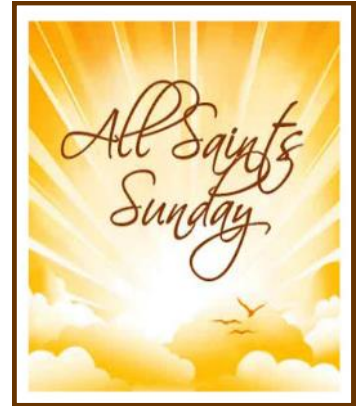

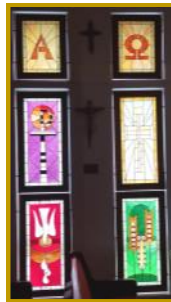

With Covid19 concerns, Lysol wipes and spray are also needed to prep and clean areas after use.
