FAITH 5 - READ

First Reading: Deuteronomy 8:7-18

- ⁷ For the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land, a land with flowing streams, with springs and underground waters welling up in valleys and hills,
- 8 a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive trees and honey,
- a land where you may eat bread without scarcity, where you will lack 9 nothing, a land whose stones are iron and from whose hills you may mine copper.
- ¹⁰ You shall eat your fill and bless the LORD your God for the good land that he has given you.
- ¹¹ Take care that you do not forget the LORD your God, by failing to keep his commandments, his ordinances, and his statutes, which I am commanding you today.
- ¹² When you have eaten your fill and have built fine houses and live in them,
- ¹³ and when your herds and flocks have multiplied, and your silver and gold is multiplied, and all that you have is multiplied,
- ¹⁴ then do not exalt yourself, forgetting the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery,
- ¹⁵ who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid wasteland with poisonous snakes and scorpions. He made water flow for you from flint rock,
- ¹⁶ and fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you, and in the end to do you good.
- ¹⁷ Do not say to yourself, "My power and the might of my own hand have gotten me this wealth."
- ¹⁸ But remember the LORD your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant that he swore to your ancestors, as he is doing today.

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 9:6-15 (Bold - Verse of Faith5)

- ⁶ The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully.
- ⁷ Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.
- ⁸ And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work.
- ⁹ As it is written,

"He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor;

his righteousness endures forever."

- ¹⁰He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness.
- ¹¹You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us;
- ¹² for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God.
- ¹³ Through the testing of this ministry you glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others,
- ¹⁴ while they long for you and pray for you because of the surpassing grace of God that he has given you.

GOSPEL: Luke 17:11-19

A Samaritan leper becomes a model for thanksgiving. He does not take for granted the kindness shown to him but takes time to thank Jesus and to glorify God.

¹¹On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. ¹²As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, ¹³they called out, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" ¹⁴When he saw them, he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were made clean. ¹⁵Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. ¹⁶He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷Then Jesus asked, "Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? ¹⁸Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" ¹⁹Then he said to him, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well."

FAITH5 - TALK



AFFIRMATION of BAPTISM

CONFIRMATION

Affirmation of Baptism: Public Profession of Faith is the rite used with young adults who desire to affirm their baptism in the presence of the assembly to mark this significant milestone in their lifelong journey and formation of faith.

PRESENTATION

The presiding minister addresses the congregation. The confirmands stand. Their families, godparents and congregation are present to support them this day.

- P: Dear friends, we give thanks to God for the gift of baptism and for each of you, one with us in the body of Christ, as you affirm your baptism this day as a sign of your participation in the life of this community of faith and its mission in the world.
- P: The Lord be with you.
- C: And also with you.
- P: Let us pray.
- C: Merciful God, we thank you for these young people whom you have made your own by water and the word in baptism. You have called them to yourself, enlightened them with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished them in the community of faith. Uphold these, your servants, as they affirm the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth through this holy sacrament. We ask this in the name of Christ. Amen.

PROFESSION of FAITH

RENUNCIATION OF EVIL

The presiding minister addresses those affirming baptism:

P: As you affirm your baptism, I ask you to reject sin, profess your faith in Christ, and confess the faith of the church.

P: Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Response: We renounce them.

P: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Response: We renounce them.

P: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

Response: We renounce them.

The presiding minister may also say to those affirming baptism:

P: Do you turn to Christ as your Lord and Savior? **Response:** In faith I turn to Christ.

The confirmands, parents and godparents come forward.

P: With the whole church and all the saints, let us profess our faith.

- P: Do you believe in God the Father?
- C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- C: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

- P: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- C: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

COMMITMENT

The presiding minister addresses those making affirmation:

P: You have made public profession of your faith.

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and be present at the Lord's table, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Each confirmand responds: I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly:

- P: People of God, do you promise to support these sisters and brother and pray for them in their life in Christ?
- C: We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

PRAYER OF BLESSING

Those affirming baptism may kneel. The presiding minister continues:

P: Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, wash us from sin, and raise us to eternal life.

The following blessing is repeated for each confirmand. The presiding minister and families may lay both hands on the head of each person while speaking the blessing:

P: Stir up in (*name*) the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever. Amen

Parents, sponsors, mentors, or other representatives of the congregation may also offer a blessing.

SHARING OF THE PEACE

- P: The peace of the Lord be with you always.
- C: And also with you.



The ancient practice in sharing the peace is encouraged by all in attendance. When we do this, the congregation greets one another in the name of the Lord acknowledging Jesus the Christ at the center of our lives.

FAITH5 - PRAY

- P: Longing for Christ's reign to come among us, we pray for the outpouring of God's power on the church, the world, and all in need
- A brief silence.
- P: Gracious God, you send from your abundance the people, talents, and resources needed for all the ministries of your church. We give thanks for the work you have accomplished through your people, and we pray for your continued blessings in our ministry together. Hear us, O God.

C: Your mercy is great.

- P: Bountiful God, you feed us through the richness of the land, water, sunlight, and ample crops. Bless all those who cultivate the land to bring forth its bounty, especially farmers and migrant workers. Hear us, O God.
- C: Your mercy is great.

P: Loving God, you open our hearts in compassion for one another. We give you thanks for the care and healing received through the hands and feet of your servants. Send us to love those most in need of your mercy (*especially*).

C: Your mercy is great.

Here other intercessions may be offered.

- P: Gracious God, we ask that you bless the fruits of our labor and the whole mission of Women of the ELCA, that together we may minister to our neighbors in need. Bless all who give and all who receive, as we are sewn together in the unity of your Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Hear us, O God.
- C: Your mercy is great.

C: Amen.

P: Receive our prayers in the name of Jesus Christ our Savior, until that day when you gather all creation around your throne where you will reign forever and ever.

THE OFFERING IS GIVEN

Giving is good for the giver; promoting our trust in God and providing blessings to the world.

THANKOFFERING

As we make our Thankofferings today, we share in a tradition that goes back to the 1800s or even earlier. Then, when it seemed that there was not enough money to carry out the work of the church, the women would act together as "cent" or "mite" societies. Each woman would set aside offerings at home throughout the year in thanksgiving for blessings received. And on occasion, the women would come together as we do today, joining their offerings together to support ministry of many kinds.

When Women of the ELCA was formed in 1987, we committed to continue this tradition of giving in gratitude for blessings. Each year, in thousands of congregations, Thankofferings are given to support the life-changing ministries of Women of the ELCA. Together, we do more than we could ever do apart. In gratitude for all God has given to us, and with hope for all that is to come, let us now give our Thankoffering.
