Pastor's Pen:



New Year, New Life

Happy New Year! Sincerely! Jesus meets us with God's presence of grace. Grace brings **forgiveness** for the past, loving **acceptance** of the present, and **hope** for the future. Jesus meets us with good news.

We know that not all hopes and wishes from last New Year's were fulfilled. The pandemic altered many things about our lives. Some things went MUCH differently than hoped for. Tension between last year's *hopes* and actual *experiences* challenge us to *greater faith* – faith that God *is* working for what is good, even when it's not what we wish for.

Knowing this, how can we face a new year? How do you live without becoming cynical about your hopes, or repeatedly duped like Charlie Brown, Lucy, and the Football? I believe a healthy response to this is examining our hopes and where they are placed.

The changes we experience often pose difficulties for human beings who resist change. By the time you can say "this or that" has changed, it's already changed again. It's hard to ground ourselves and our hopes in passing circumstances and conditions. Sometimes, life can seem new and uncertain each day.

To people of his time and future generations, St. Paul wrote in Romans 6 about "**newness** of *life*" *linking it to baptism*. He affirms the senselessness for anyone to go on living in sin (destructive patterns). Believers have died to that way of life. Then he writes (vs. 3-4), "Do you not know that *all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death*? Therefore, we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, *just as Christ was raised from the dead* by the glory of the Father, so *we too might walk in the newness of life*."

"Walking" is always current, always *now*. It means *living*. Baptism *daily* brings the grace of God. We can walk in it not only New Year's Day, but also each day of 2021. Walking and living in ever-new grace means giving up destructive patterns and habits...with God's help. It means replacing old patterns with new ways of thinking, doing, and deciding – *new*, *healthier ways of relating to God and other people*.

In what ways can we change our relationships for the better? God's grace leads us forward. Remember your Baptism and its meaning; stay connected with Jesus each day. The changes will be good. May yours be a Blessed and Happy 2021 New Year!



(WalMart has LED tubes that can be used as T8 OR T12 - Box of 10 for \$42.88)




