

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CALL TO WORSHIP




P: Blessed be the holy Trinity, ₱ one God,








FAITH 5 - READ

First Reading: Genesis 1:1-5

- ¹ In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth,
- ² the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters.
- ³ Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light.
- ⁴ And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness.
- ⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

Here ends the reading.

Psalm: 29



- ¹Ascribe to the LORD, you gods, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength.
- ²Ascribe to the LORD the glory due God's name; worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness.
- ³The voice of the LORD is upon the waters; the God of glory thunders; the LORD is upon the mighty waters.
- ⁴The voice of the LORD is a powerful voice; the voice of the LORD is a voice of splendor.
- ⁵The voice of the LORD breaks the cedar trees; the LORD breaks the cedars of Lebanon;
- ⁶the LORD makes Lebanon skip like a calf, and Mount Hermon like a young wild ox.
- ⁷The voice of the LORD bursts forth in lightning flashes.
- ⁸The voice of the LORD shakes the wilderness; the LORD shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.
- ⁹The voice of the LORD makes the oak trees writhe and strips the forests bare. And in the temple of the LORD all are crying, "Glory!"
- ¹⁰The LORD sits enthroned above the flood; the LORD sits enthroned as king for evermore.
- ¹¹O LORD, give strength to your people; give them, O LORD, the blessings of peace.

Second Reading: Acts 19:1-7

(Bold - verse for FAITH5)

- ¹ While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples.
- ² He said to them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?" They replied, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit."
- ³ Then he said, "Into what then were you baptized?" They answered, "Into John's baptism."
- ⁴ Paul said, "John baptized with the baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus."
- ⁵ On hearing this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus.
- ⁶ When Paul had laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied –
- ⁷ altogether there were about twelve of them.

GOSPEL: Mark 1:4-11






⁴John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. ⁸I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

⁹In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. ¹¹And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."



P: O God,


