Pastor's Pen:

Loving Different People

February is famous for Valentine's Day and "love". It's is also Black History Month. The combination might cause us to reflect on what we mean by "love" in a society and culture that nowadays is filled with fear about people who are different from 'us'. Humans draw lines of difference between races, cultures, sexual orientations, religion and many other human conditions. In what ways are we called by Jesus to "love our neighbor"? With God's help, everyone can learn some things. I'll focus on "prejudice".

What exactly is prejudice? The dictionary defines prejudice as: "noun, **1.** preconceived opinion that is not based on reason or actual experience (such as: *English prejudice against foreigners* | *anti-Jewish prejudices*); dislike, hostility, or unjust behavior formed on such a basis".

Prejudice is an inner reaction of fear. If yours is not racial, there are many other varieties of prejudice to choose from. Honesty helps us admit that we've had "preconceived opinions..." about other people and groups "not based on reason or actual experience" resulting in "dislike, hostility, or unjust behavior formed on such a basis."

Jesus' actions reveal that truth and love raises awareness of the problem and our participation in it. Forgiving grace and acceptance from God in Jesus is the way out to a better way of living and relating.

In the Bible, the writer of James counsels, "Do not speak evil against one another, brothers and sisters. Who ever speaks evil against another or judges another, judges the law; but if you judge the law, you are *not a doer* of the law, but a *judge*. There is One lawgiver and Judge who is able to save and destroy. So then, *who are you* to judge your neighbor?" (4:11-12)

The writer of 1 John gives us some alternatives to judging and pre-judging. In 4:19-21, we read, "We love because [God] first loved us. Those who say, 'I love God,' and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who *do not love* a brother or sister whom they *have seen*, cannot *love God* whom they *have not seen*. The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also."

A few years ago, the PBS *Civil War* series by Ken Burns concluded with one historian remarking that if we are not careful, the American Civil War can still be lost in our day. Those lives sacrificed for freedom and equality for all Americans are wasted to the degree that racist attitudes are harbored and spread.

This month, let's love our sweethearts. But let's also be inclusive of others through the greater, deeper love of God. Jesus gave his life to reconcile all to God, to heal human divisions, and love through us. May that grace of God not be wasted on us.

Hello, New Life Church family,

In January, I attended our monthly meeting of the ELCA's Youth Ministry Network. The youth pastors are very dedicated, and their youthfulness is always a blessing. This year there is no Lutherhill high school retreat in February. However, women can go to Lutherhill on March 5-7 for \$160 per woman. The theme is Imago Dei (image of God) and photographer Ashleigh Reid will take individual photos. This is a time for body and spirit renewal. Also on March 26-28, youth in grades 1st-6th can attend Lutherhill's retreat for \$80 (weekend event) and \$30 for just Saturday.

In Pearland, Pearland Arts League is presenting their winter exhibition. Eight artists installed an exhibit of smaller works to be displayed and for sale through February 2021. This exhibition is open to the public during office hours of the Pearland Chamber of Commerce located at 6711 Broadway Street. Go as a family and enjoy the talents of our local artists.

I am restarting Sunday school through Zoom, and I have emailed as many families as I could. The response has been lackluster, but thanks to the one student who has shown up twice so far. 

Thursday, February 11, Garden Lecture resumes virtually on Facebook at 7 P.M. Brazoria County Extension is the presenter or you can link to it from KPB/events. The topic is "Pruning Ornamental Trees".

Saturday, February 20 is our next adopt-a spot cleanup. Meet at the church at 8:30 A.M. and wear your mask. We will observe social distancing and wear gloves. Snacks, juice and coffee will be provided.



Coming in March is a city-wide tree planting event. Volunteers will be needed. Watch for details next month. Also, there will be a river cleanup event on March 13.



Barbara, Matt, Ed, and Michael Scott and Ed and Alex Tatuaca participated in the Dune Building Day in Surfside, Saturday, January 16. They spent the morning tying Christmas trees together to catch sand in ebbing tides to build dunes to protect the coastline. Other years volunteers have also planted sea grass on the dunes to keep the sand in place, but there was no grass planting this year. Each year the Stella Roberts Recycle Center collects live trees after Christmas for this project. There were fewer trees this year than usual. Keep in mind to donate your tree next year if you decorate a live tree.

Recycling with a Super Worm: According to "Medical Discovery News", presented by UTMB on public radio, the 2 ½ inch long larvae of a beetle called Zophobas atratus can digest Styrofoam. Through scientific testing, they learned that these larvae carry a microbe in their gut that can digest the polystyrene plastic and produce carbon dioxide,



a breathable gas. Next, they hope to isolate the microbe, probably a bacterium, and mass produce it in order to recycle the thirty million tons of Styrofoam produced each year. (I can't even imagine one ton of Styrofoam.) This will bring us one step closer to reducing plastic waste that has been accumulating for decades. The North Pacific Gyro contains nearly two trillion pieces of plastic floating in a vortex, weighing eighty thousand tons.






