Pastor's Pen:

Lent: Investments and Dividends



"Dust you are, and to dust you shall return." On Ash Wednesday and all throughout Lent, we are reminded of our mortality, our sin, our frailty. We may not consider this an "uplifting" message. We may ask why we should spend what seems like too long of a season contemplating the "dark" side of our humanity and the Christian message.

We need the reminder. It impresses on us what sort of darkness our Lord Jesus entered for our sakes, and in which he died. Through the message of Lent the Spirit also rekindles in us the fire that only the grace of God can start.

Forty days (excluding Sundays) is set aside to bring home to us the grace of God that moved God to be with us in Jesus. Why take so much time with special services and other activities? I, for one, do not have enough personal discipline to do alone by myself the kind of reflection and worship as we do together during Lent. So, I welcome the quieter tones and healing messages of Lent.

I welcome the rest which comes from a gracious Lord who says, "Come to me, all you who labor hard and are burdened down, and I will give you rest." This is our purpose in worship. Our fellowship during Lent is designed to slow us down, help us reflect, and gain refreshment, so that when Easter's hopeful proclamation comes, our rejoicing has deep and rich meaning.

The Lenten journey is one of meaningful reflection, purposeful engagement and gracious receiving. We reflect on the meanings of Jesus' trial, sufferings and death at Calvary. We engage purposefully in drawing on the strength afforded by forgiveness of sin and mutual encouragement in faith. We graciously receive what God has provided for restoration, life, and hope.

Make time for Lent activities. Alongside coming to Wednesday evening services, you may want to find some time to spend in Bible reading, quiet meditation, or doing something creative and constructive for which you ordinarily would not take time. You may have to trade one of your usual activities to do this. The investment is minimal compared with the life-giving dividends!



Some have to leave home because there is no water at all, in unending drought. Some are not welcome anywhere else because others live there and fight them to keep what they have. Some die of thirst.

Water is a finite resource, but it is renewable. On our planet there is enough for all. We can reuse it over and over and we know how. In nature it is cleaned by filtration, sedimentation, and evaporation and distributed underground, above ground, and in the air. We know how to **reduce** what we need, **reuse** what we have, and **recycle** what we use. We can be mindful and grateful for this gift of God and we can share it with others through organizations such as Water to Thrive and Lutheran World Action. Water nourishes, cleanses, refreshes. 


As of February 2020, **754** prayer shawls and **40** baby afghans have been made and distributed to those in need. This ministry only has a few


