

Pastor's Pen: Life's Resurrection



When Summer comes to an end, Autumn leads us daily into the time of cold and darkness of Winter. Trees go dormant, some grass turns brown, and some days look and feel downright gloomy. Why talk about winter in springtime? Through the changing of the seasons in nature God communicates the changing nature of our lives. We experience ends and beginnings. Firsts and lasts. Death and Resurrection. Adults of various ages pass away. Children are born. In the midst of all of life's changes, God is present with grace and life. God gives life through the suffering, death and rising of Jesus our Lord.

The inner life of our spiritual selves goes through the same kinds of cycles. The fear and uncertainty of a child's first day of kindergarten eventually gives way to joy at the beginning summer vacation. For adults, life may seem great and health good. Yet, when these are disturbed with severe illness, tragedy or sad events, it seems like a certain kind of "death" occurs. Death of expectations. Death of hopes. Death of dreams.

Sometimes these experiences can seem like nights without end. In Psalm 30:5 the Scripture says, "Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning."

Joy comes whenever illness subsides and health and life return. Jesus has healed the wounds in our relationship with God. God affirms what Jesus did on the Cross: affirming God's stance of forgiveness toward us--no matter what. Jesus came to proclaim, portray and live what God's forgiving and healing grace does. Jesus *lives*! Winter *gives way* to Spring. Gloom *turns* to bright clarity. Fear is *cast out* and replaced with an infinite love. The Spirit of God *revises* and *recreates* our hopes, dreams, and expectations.

Whatever today, tomorrow, next month or next year holds, Jesus' resurrection sheds light on it. It's not a magical or mystical light. It's the light we see in Jesus' face as the Holy Spirit enlightens our imaginations. "For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness', who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." (2 Corinthians 4:6) New life is in Jesus. New life is yours. It's a new day of life and joy in Jesus' resurrection!



The 2021 Flower Chart is up in the Narthex.







Earth Day is an annual event celebrated around the world on April 22 to demonstrate support for environmental protection. It was first celebrated in 1970 and now includes events coordinated globally by the Earth Day Network in more than 193 countries. The Founder was Senator Gaylord Nelson from Wisconsin. His concern for environmental tragedies such as the oil spill in Santa Barbara and growing public awareness of the impact of industry on public health and his awareness of the energy of college youth in the anti-war movement inspired him to action. He convinced U.S. Representative Peter McCloskey to be his co-chair They enlisted young activist Denis Hayes to organize campus teach-ins on college campuses and to promote events across America including diverse organizations, uniting them in the cause for a healthier environment. Earth Day inspired 20 million Americans to demonstrate against the impact of 150 years of industrial development which caused serious human health issues.




