Pastor's Pen:



Pentecost Birth: New Life in the Spirit!

A mother brings a new life into this world. We say that she "gave birth". The new baby is small and vulnerable. Now, however, a new kind of life is possible. "Birth" is what we say Luke described on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2). The "church"--a people formed by God's grace in Jesus--was born. Disciples had gathered and were waiting as Jesus had commanded them. They received God's Holy Spirit as promised and were empowered with a new kind of life.

May 23 was Pentecost Sunday. May 30 was Trinity Sunday. Now we are in the Pentecost "season": a half-year in which focus shifts from the life of Jesus to the life and growth of God's people. Gospel readings for Sundays after Pentecost lead us into teachings of Jesus and the early church, and how they apply in real life. The Pentecost Scriptures help us to respond to questions like, "What does the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus mean for us?" "What does it mean to be a part of the Body of Christ?" and "What does it mean to me to be Jesus' disciple?"

In New Testament Greek, "*ekklesia*", the word for "church", means "*called out*". It was used to help Christians to understand that they are a people whom God "called out" from the world to empower them to live as God's people in a world where evil is common. We sometimes call our gathering for worship "church"--we are "called out" from daily life in the world to gather and take in God's word of grace in Jesus Christ. By grace, God's Spirit "calls, gathers, and enlightens" us, giving us birth with empowerment and new life not otherwise possible.

The church is not as much a "place" as it is a **PEOPLE**... *God's* **people**, called by a grace and a Baptism in which is God's power to save, heal, forgive, enlighten, and bless. You have a place in worship, to be empowered and enlivened, and then sent out to live in this world to witness the grace of God. A blessed Pentecost Season to you!



Shoe Drive continues through June 30 at the Stella Roberts Recycling Center, 5800 Magnolia Parkway. Drop off pairs of new or clean, wearable, gently worn used shoes.

I can walk around my house at night without turning on lights if I have my drapes open, because of all the lights outside in addition to the little red lights on electronic devices that make excellent reference points. I don't keep outside lights on. I turn them on when I'm going outside or I'm expecting someone. My neighbors, however, have door lights, flood lights, and driveway and garage lights, besides the street lights on every corner. Then there's the glow on the horizon from a nearby shopping center. While believing we're safer by turning night into day, we are probably doing more harm. According to the International Dark Sky Association, data does not support the belief that light prevents home invasion and burglary. In fact, improper lighting can assist a burglar. Someone operating in the shadows but with the assistance of outdoor lighting is not as obvious as someone skulking around with a flashlight.

The circadian rhythm in all animals predisposes us to best practices for daylight and nighttime. One of the reasons cited for insomnia is late exposure to white light or sunlight. Most of us now have energy saving long lasting LED bulbs in our lighting. I know I prefer the blue white light, but the yellow is really better for your eyes and should be used outside and in ambient indoor lighting and white light for reading lamps. White light is also what you see on computer and TV screens, which is why one should limit one's screen time.

The yellow street lights are actually sodium lights and easier on the eyes of drivers. The best street lighting also focuses the light downward and does not allow light beams to escape to outer space. Planetary light pollution and lights out for migration is a topic for another time.

Let your God given light shine all over this land, but be careful how you use your electric lights. *Helen Beckman*
