Often, when natural disasters strike or when war drives families from their homes, our hearts ache with compassion, but we don't know how to help. Making Lutheran World Relief Kits is a simple, fun and tangible way to offer comfort to those suffering and express love to our neighbors in need.

LWR Kits are specifically designed to help people coping with poverty, disaster, conflict and more. Whether a kit helps someone to maintain good hygiene, care well for a newborn baby, keep education going during a crisis or learn a new vocation, LWR Kits provide dignity and hope in the direst situations.

"BE PREPARED" – it's the Boy Scouts' motto, and our pantries, tornado shelters and "car trunk emergency supplies" all seem to affirm the fact that having some necessities on hand in case of an emergency is a good idea.

In relief work, we call that idea preparedness and in LWR projects around the world, preparedness is often woven into the overall project plan. For example, we work with communities to save seeds for future growing seasons, firm up river banks, build homes on safer sites, all in hopes that these precautions will help limit the impact of the next drought, flood or storm. Quilts and kits can also be part of a preparedness plan, especially when LWR pre-positions those items in a secure location close to regions particularly vulnerable to emergencies.

Additional quilts and kits, as well as water filtration units, were shipped to Haiti immediately following the hurricane, and LWR's team of staff and partners on the ground will continue working with communities and the Haitian government to support recovery and rebuilding efforts in the months to come.

Thanks to YOUR gifts and the hard work of LWR's country staff and partners, a little preparation continue to go a long way! New Life joins the effort this summer collecting Personal Care Kit and School Kit items to be packed by the New Life Seniors on the first Wednesdays in August and September. See page 10 for items still needed. Collection Bins will be in the Narthex and the Fellowship Hall hallway.

Pastor's Pen:

God Is All For Freedom

IN JULY, WE HAVE U. S. Independence Day, and for us, a natural time for thoughts about "freedom". Like the words "love" and "faith", "freedom" is a word that has many meanings, depending on how you use it. Let's ask ourselves, "How do I choose to use my freedom?" and "Does God have anything to say about freedom and how we are to use it?"

One of the earliest lessons on responsible freedom my father taught me as a child was "Your freedom to swing your fist ends where another person's nose begins." He was pointing out that freedom to live does not mean freedom to do anything you want to do... especially if it's something that can hurt someone else.

A few years ago, a news report in Montreal, Canada was about a hospital where a patient exercised what she felt was her freedom and rights. The 73-year-old woman insisted on lighting a cigarette while she was hooked up to an oxygen supply. It resulted in a small explosion that caused her minor burns. The flames were doused quickly. One hospital worker suffered hand burns. Some patients were moved to another wing. Hospital spokesperson Luc Perreault said that the woman had been warned. She had been told not to light up. "She's lucid and independent," Perreault said, "She had read the directives about not smoking." He said that, under the Charter of Rights and Freedoms, the hospital did not have the right to remove the patient's lighter before the accident occurred. "We can't take away personal belongings," he said. "It's not a prison."

Instead of freedom for harm, God's word offers insight for people of faith. In **Galatians 5**, St. Paul tells of freedom under God's grace:

¹For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery...

¹³For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. ¹⁴For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' ¹⁵If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another. ¹⁶Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh.

²² By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things."

Read that list again! You can have as much as you want of this fruit! The Spirit gives you grace to believe and live in the forgiveness and kindness of God. Go for it! Live by the Spirit who gives the freedom to love others as you have been loved by God.




Call Committee Update,

For those who haven't heard, the call committee has been hard at work to help New Life find its newest pastor. The process is expected to take 6-9 months and we began the process at the end of April. Before we can interview candidates, we have to create a job profile and listing using a standardized form that the ELCA has created. This is the part of the process that we are currently working on. It involves an in-depth analysis of us as a congregation, where we see ourselves going, and what we would like from a new pastor. As we continue our work on this, we are developing questions to put into a survey that we will send out to the congregation. This will give us guidance as to whether we're on the right track or not with our work. Once we've completed our job profile, it will be entered into a database and we will be matched with potential candidates. From there interviews will be conducted and a job offer will be extended to a candidate. Members of the call committee are more than happy to discuss the process and where we're at. The only information we cannot disclose is information about the candidates. 

Christian Helping Hands

The basket is out all the time by the Fellowship Hall and the Sunday food drives will continue for the foreseeable future as CHH distributes to more than twice the families as before the pandemic. Judy has been delivering the food from the basket on Thursday mornings. During May & June, 90 lbs. of Chicken from the Stavinoha's, and more than 400 lbs of misc food was delivered. 
