Pastor's Pen:



"Being One of Us"

"As the story goes..." I must have been around 5 or 6 years old. My family were on a long road trip on vacation. As happens on road trips, the car needs gas and the humans need relief. So, we stopped at a gas station to get snacks and use the facilities. In those days, in the absence of a convenience store, a Coke machine sufficed. This Coke machine was the old-fashioned kind with a crank handle. I became fascinated with it, cranking the handle over and over.

My family had all gotten back in the car. I was still fiddling with the machine. My dad (who was driving) called to me several times to come get in the car. I ignored him. Then he did the unthinkable. He started (slowly) to drive away. That got my attention!

"As the story goes..." I ran, panicked, shouting, "I want to be one of us! I want to be one of us!" I got in the car and all was well.

Belonging is a need we all share. It's a need many people struggle with. Families are a blessing, but they can also at times be alienating or suffocating. Being allowed to be yourself and be accepted as you are – these are gifts to be treasured.

So many of the usual social customs and behaviors have been disrupted because of the Pandemic. In extending acceptance or seeking belonging, our efforts are often frustrated as we must physically distance and refrain from some of our signs of acceptance or belonging.

God values community. In fact, God so much desired a reunion with alienated humankind, that God became "one of us!" As the Word-made-flesh from eternity, Jesus was born a human to live and experience life among us.

The same Jesus was alienated on the Cross, giving his life to redeem ours. He spoke to our need for belonging by saying things like, "Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age," (Matthew 28:20) and "Come to me, all you who are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28)

As Summer continues and then gives way to Fall, let's remember that we have a risen Savior who is closer to us than we can imagine. Jesus accepts us and welcomes us. In him, and in the Body of Christ, we belong. In Christ we each become "one of us!"



Dear Church Family,

Summer feels like it's flying by so quickly and we're already talking about school starting! Speaking of school, let's talk about Sunday School. We are still looking for a superintendent and Sunday School teachers.

According to New Life's membership roll, we have 34 families with children ages 3 – 18. There is a total of 69 children within that group. Some of the older ones may be going off to college, trade schools or jobs, but that still leaves many within our congregation who need ways to continue learning the Bible and to grow in their faith. Typically, that has been through on-site Sunday School and youth groups, as well as confirmation classes.

Last spring when we returned to in-person church, we had only three kids who regularly attended Sunday School, with the teenager joining the ABC - Adult Bible Class. Sang Kim offered virtual classes to the high school students, but it was poorly attended. I know the past year and a half has challenged us all in many ways, but it's time now to look to the future.

MaryAnn Marcha, Julia Sweet and Lorraine Walls have committed to teaching this fall. The ABC class is a group effort and function on their own. Pastor Bill is continuing his Zoom class, and Korie Williams is considering leading a high-school class, if there is any interest from that age group. But we need to hear from you.

What do you want Sunday School to look like? Will the parents of school age children be bringing their children back to in-person church? Council members Lynn Cope and Barbara Scott are currently working on these challenges. So, if you get a letter or phone call from them, please respond so we can plan accordingly.

The Call Committee recently sent out a survey to get input from the congregation on the Mission Site Profile. In order to begin the actual search process for a new pastor, this must be completed first. Please provide your input to the survey. If you cannot complete it online, there will be a paper copy available upon request and your answers will remain anonymous.


Call Committee Update,



For those who haven't heard, the call committee has been hard at work to help New Life find its newest pastor. The process is expected to take 6-9 months and we began the process at the end of April. Before we can interview candidates, we have to create a job profile and listing using a standardized form that the ELCA has created. This is the part of the process that we are currently working on. It involves an in-depth analysis of us as a congregation, where we see ourselves going, and what we would like from a new pastor. As we continue our work on this, we developed questions for the survey that has been emailed out to the congregation the last two Wednesdays. Your response will give us guidance as to whether we're on the right track or not with our work. If needed, paper copies of the survey are available in the Narthex. Our deadline to fill them out is August 15th. Once we've completed our job profile, it will be entered into a database and we will be matched with potential candidates. From there interviews will be conducted and a job offer will be extended to a candidate. Members of the call committee are more than happy to discuss the process and where we're at. The only information we cannot disclose is information about the candidates. 

Mark your Calendars - Saturday, September 18 is City Wide Cleanup and we will be picking up litter on our Adopt-a-Spot.

We have been taught that during photosynthesis, while they are making their own food, trees are taking in CO2, carbon dioxide, and giving off oxygen, O2. That's true and since we need O2, to breathe, we understand that we need trees in our environment to clean our air and supply O2. In the process, trees store carbon and it makes up most of their mass. When a tree dies and biodegrades or burns, it releases carbon back into the atmosphere. A large tree produces more O2 than small trees. So, when we cut down a large tree and replace it with several small trees, it doesn't clean the air as well until the small trees become large. In a healthy forest, the balance of O2 to CO2 is positive, but when a forest is dying off, it begins to go the other way. Our planet has been served well by the O2 produced and the CO2 taken in by tropical rainforests, but in recent years destruction of some rainforest land to make way for farm land has greatly reduced the amount of oxygen produced and carbon sequestered. The fires in the western U.S. are a human and environmental tragedy. We also put carbon in the air when we burn carbon-based fossil fuels. CO2 is the most common greenhouse gas (GHG). The green house effect makes our planet livable by trapping heat in our atmosphere, but with too much GHG in our atmosphere we have too much global warming resulting in many forms of climate change, extreme weather events, and environmental changes that threaten the existence of many species. All of God's creation is extremely complex,



with interrelating natural cycles. Scientists don't have all the answers, but are always learning and studying and much is gained because of it. God reveals himself in wonderful ways if we trust Him and observe and study His beautiful world. He wants us to care for it and each other.




