Beginning in 1983 out of a need to feed the hungry in the Pearland, Texas area, a ministry was born. Nine local clergy welcomed the idea to have a Christian organization that would aid and service the growing problem of hungry people. The original nine churches provided the core of such an organization and it was officially born on April 30, 1984 and was in operation by July 2, 1984.

Christian Helping Hands is operated by an ALL-VOLUNTEER staff. The [member-churches](#) have grown from nine to over twenty and from all denominations. They all follow God's command "therefore I command you, You shall open wide your hand to your brother, to the needy and to the poor in this land." Deuteronomy 15:11

A 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, Christian Helping Hands has assisted the needy residing in Pearland, Friendswood, Brookside and Manvel (Texas) with food, clothing vouchers, medical vouchers as well as emergency lodging, as funds are available.

Need has outgrown the Swensen Rd facility. Ground-Breaking for a new, much larger facility for Christian Helping Hands and the Seva Clinic was held on Saturday, September 18th. The new property is located at 4305 Magnolia Pkwy Pearland, TX 77584

Pastor's Pen:

Celebrating Change—Reformation!

Semper Reformanda! Always Reforming! That is God's work – taking one thing and forming it into something else – something life-giving. God has been doing this since the beginning of the creation of this universe. Reformation begins in God – living, active, gracious and loving. This alone is worth celebrating.

Lutherans and other Christians observe and celebrate God's work in specific times in history. For example, in 1517, Martin Luther was a German monk and professor in the Catholic Church. On October 31 of that year he posted on the Wittenberg church door some 95 academic points for debate among his colleagues. His intention was to call the church of his day to Biblical truth away from abuses in practice that had grown up over time. It is considered to be an act which began reform in the church, beginning the Protestant Reformation and changing the course of western civilization. Lutherans, Catholics and other Christians of our day look back at Luther's work from various perspectives and recognize God's hand at work through him and the other reformers.

In 2021, God is at work reforming New Life Lutheran, Pearland. We have been in the transition of interim time between settled pastors for sixteen months now. As is typical, the needs and outlook of ministry changes as our lives continue to flow and develop. God has healed some wounded relationships and is working on others. Some newcomers have attended worship and look to become members. Many NLLC members have returned to in-person fellowship and activities. The Pandemic has changed how we do some things, yet God's Spirit continues to work through the Scriptures and sacraments.

The New Life Lutheran Call Committee is immersed in their work of identifying the needs and ministries of our church. The Mission Site Profile (MSP) will soon be finalized to send on to the Bishop's Associate. Your prayers for the Call Committee and our Church Council are much needed and appreciated as they seek to help us "find our way forward" at God's direction. No one has yet produced a crystal ball that works; all the more reason to ask God for the faith and discernment that will lead us forward into God's preferred future!

Semper Reformanda! Always Reforming – means change. God's work of changing our lives and our church can sometimes be uncomfortable. Sometimes we are even called by God to challenge our society and church of our day. As we stay tuned to God's Spirit, grace in Jesus Christ will lead us through all change. This gives us the hope (and even joy!) we need to be able follow on the path where our Lord leads.

Call Committee Update,

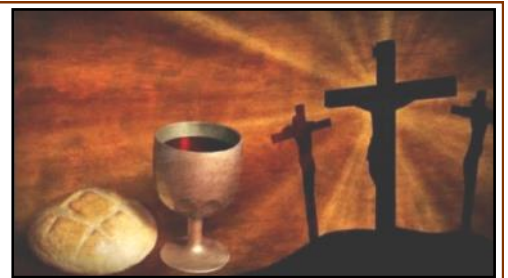

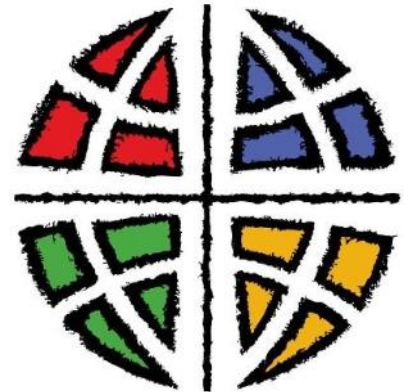

We think that the heavy rain and wind storm that preceded the event probably washed most butts down the drains. Also, most residents had raked up the storm debris and probably got the litter with the leaves. Unfortunately, due to the heat and slight physical limitations, we only covered Orange St. from Main to the church. The stretch from the church to Schleider Dr. still remains. If a couple of people will volunteer to finish it up with me, you can choose the day and time. Students will get volunteer credit for school. We have a reputation to uphold as the longest continuous participant in the Pearland adopt-a-spot program. We may do our November cleanup later in the month.

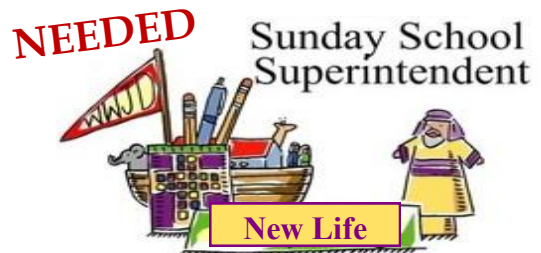

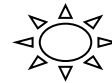
