"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline." – Proverbs 1:7



Happy New Year!

I'm just curious how will you answer these questions dear friend. How many times in the past year have you not acted and then regretted it? How many times have you made decisions without praying, and then prayed to diminish the damage caused by your awful decisions?

Many times, we have heard someone said, "*The New Year gives us an opportunity to do some things differently*". The wise writer of the Book of Proverbs begins with one simple insight: "*The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge…*" The understanding here has to do with the attitude of how we start or begin. Due to the nature of the book, we read and hear its words often as instructional. Its like an everyday inspiration to begin our daily decision with gratitude that God is with us, in us and God is watching over us. In our everyday endeavor put God first.

I remember this game I played with my friends before, we will all stand behind a line yards away from the leader who is standing in front of us. He/she would say to us giant or baby steps we could take forward. Sometimes the leader would say, "Timmy, you may take five baby steps forward." I would eagerly take my steps, making them as baby as I can. Then I would hear her say, "Timmy, go back!" "But why?" I questioned. "You didn't say, 'May I?!" This simple and fun game always reminds me of how one should listen and most importantly acknowledge the leader. And yet in my life, honestly at times I often have not listened and acknowledged God.

Proverbs states its theme explicitly how we give reverence to God with the respect He deserves. It means living our lives in light of what we know of Him, holding Him in the highest estimation, and offering to God ourselves, trusting him fully. This is the truth, that God is worthy to direct our beginnings and God is worthy of blessing our endings, too. Solomon wished that his readers would attain practical righteousness in all things by living our lives under the authority and direction of our loving and merciful God. The book also emphasizes listening to others so that we might learn from them and apply the combined knowledge of those who have gone before us—such as parents, friends, and elders—to the unique circumstances of our own lives. For wisdom also involves taking a measure of humbleness, first before God and then before others.

Most of the proverbs in the book are brief statements allowing us to see very clearly how a particular proverb might be applied to a number of everyday situations we encounter – from getting up in the morning and how to build a strong foundation in our relationships with others. Proverbs reminds us that God concerns Himself with all things but even more those boring moments in our lives as well.

This New Year 2022, it is my prayer that we will all start with the knowledge and the guidance of God.

Hello fellow Christians and friends at New Life!

I pray you all have a blessed Christmas season, and a peaceful and Happy New Year! I am Mike Kiser, and I have the honor of being your new Church Council President.

Although most of you know me as the "Sound Guy" on the left during services, and the fella who sings now and again, I feel I should tell you a bit more about myself, now that I have been elected to this important position at our wonderful church!

I have been a businessman all my life, having built and run a Construction Company that specialized in roofing, siding and remodeling in greater Houston, from 1968-1994. I also am a Chemist, and I invented several world class technologies in fire protection, founding and running a company based on those technologies from 1992-2013. I shut down the Construction Company and used its assets to start the Fire Protection business as Flame Seal Products, Inc. I took that company public in 2001. My products now protect key structures around the world from fire, including The Forbidden City, The Great Hall of the People, and many ancient structures in China, as well as key government buildings here in the United States. Thousands of commercial and residential structures have also been protected. I lost control of that company in 2013, when I became critically ill with Stage IV Colon Cancer, and had to devote all my time to healing and recovery! I was given less than a 2% chance of survival, yet God blessed me with a full recovery and excellent health after a 9+ months battle! In order to REMAIN healed, I left the incredible stresses of a public company behind, and have since turned my attention to another passion of mine, music. I have been a recording artist since I was 18 years old, and successfully promoted and marketed my "folk rock" band in the 70s and 80s, called Voyager. We had an exciting run on the radio and on the charts, including one song that reached #34 on a Nashville regional chart in 1977 (two slots above Elvis' last record before his death, "Way Down"! Of course mine peaked at 34 and his was on its way UP, to peak at #18!). I was also twice written up as a recommended artist in Billboard magazine in 1981. It all fell apart in 1983 due to a tragic death. I started performing shows again in 2016, and I still play, sing and record these days in Galveston venues, and

a few in Pearland/Houston. I also make music videos, mostly writing Christian music, some of which have reached quite a wide audience.

Over the years, I have also worked at my most important passion, my church. I was a Council member of Grace Lutheran Church in my younger years. Grace is the original Lutheran Church in Houston, and is a beautiful old historic building off Westheimer on Waugh Drive. Then, due to the long distance to Grace, my wife, Terri, started attending New Life Lutheran church in Pearland, while I was out of town on numerous business trips. Soon, she had me visit with her, and of course, I joined too! I have since become more and more involved in the affairs of the Church and its wonderful members, as time has gone by. I have been on Council for the last couple years, and now am honored to help at a higher level as the Council President.

I must thank the two past Presidents, Mina Stagner and Rudy Moreno, for their respective hard work guiding New Life through very difficult times. Each brought their own vision, and special skills to this position, and this church has greatly benefited from their leadership! I will do my very best to use my knowledge and experience to carry the torch further to the benefit of our incredible church family! My primary goals will be twofold: (1) Support our excellent Call Committee, and the process of bringing a new long term Pastor to lead our congregation, and (2) Help nurture an even stronger focus on outreach, (with emphasis on current members in need), and ultimately a culture of growth!

I described a couple of my life's projects above to show that Marketing, sales and funding, have always been what I do best! Because of the experiences God has blessed me with, I have a view of our church's opportunities and potentials, that leave me truly excited about our future!

Please, I ask you all to pray for me, and for our Council and staff, asking God to guide our minds, hearts, and spirits, as we serve and guide our beautiful, faith filled Church in 2022 and beyond!

December 26 – January 8- Christmas tree collection at the Stella Roberts Recycling Center.

If you have a live Christmas tree, when it is time to dispose of it, you can put it out for curbside pickup, but please **avoid the landfill** by taking it to the Stella Roberts Recycling Center to aid in dune building at Surfside Beach. SRRC will accept all bare trees (no flocking, tinsel, or ornaments) **in a dumpster by the gate.** Leaving it on the ground outside the gate is considered dumping and could make you liable for a fine. The



trees will be taken to the coast and tied together on the beach in order to catch the sand to build or enhance the dunes. Sea grasses will also be planted on existing dunes to hold the sand. The grass covered dunes slow the waters' retreat and slow down erosion as well as protect the coast from tidal action and surges.

If you have an artificial tree that has passed its usefulness, take it to the SR Recycle Center for recycling. The Recycle Center is currently closed for the holidays and maintenance. It will reopen again at 9 A.M. Tuesday, January 4. Except for tree collection, recycling is by appointment only. To make an appointment call (281) 489-2795 or email pearlandrecycles.com/appointment>. If you can't get all your holiday trash into your cart, you're probably not recycling enough. Start by taking out and flattening all cardboard boxes to be recycled at SRRC. Most of your mail including cards, catalogs, and flimsy gift boxes and wrapping can be recycled. Put them in paper bags and dump in the paper dumpster in our parking lot.



January 15, 9A.M. to Noon is Dune Day. Meet at Stahlman Park, Surfside to sign in to help tie trees or plant grass. If there are some interested in going, call me and we can car pool from the church.




Rylynn won the spelling bee for 3rd and 4th grade students and will be representing Genoa Elementary at the district level in February. Congratulations Rylynn!
