



But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him [Jesus] who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love. - Ephesians 4:15-16 (NRSV)



The letter to the Ephesians main purposes were to help the new Christians grow in their spiritual knowledge of God and the Church, to promote unity, and to encourage the Saints to withstand the powers of evil. The scripture quoted above belongs to the second purpose to promote unity. So, in an effort to unite the Jews and the new gentile believers, Paul relates differences to various and unique parts of a body. The language of love expressed in this letter is not instructive but in truth. Meaning Paul did not instruct and tell the arms to be legs but trusted that they know the difference between the two parts. Just like the truth that we cannot disregard the differences between veins and arteries, even though they look similar. And imagine requiring the heart to function like the brain, things will be pretty hearty emotional around the church. Friends, if it's true that we're one Body, then in love we must trust and respect and honor all the unique expressions of these Body parts. We are joined and knit together and that is the only way we can function.

This month of February, it is my prayer and hope that we will be able to find our connections here in New Life. Connections that will make us function in love and trust one another as we grow in faith (not alone) but together. Believe me there is no way one can grow himself or herself alone in faith especially when you're not connected with the head who is Jesus Christ our Lord.

Remember whatever your uniqueness, gifts, or preference may be, every ligament, bone, organ, and cell of your being is important to the Body's existence — know that you are a very important part of New Life. We cannot be whole and healthy if you are not whole and well and included as an indispensable part of this, Our One Body.

Hello fellow Christians and friends at New Life!

Thank you all for the many kind “get well” wishes and prayers! Terri and I are well now, and feeling pretty good (about 90%!) We were pretty sick for a couple weeks, and even a little worried when our breathing was feeling compromised! It makes one really appreciate when we have our good health, and actually feel like doing things! I have learned that if you keep an open mind, and walk with eyes wide open, there is always a lesson or two in every hardship (along with blessings as well!), and this was no exception.

So... I want to share a story with you all. Right in the middle of this “Covid” experience, a very close friend, Bruce Laughlin, who does wood crafts at our annual Bazaar, and many of you know, went in the hospital in grave condition. He has leukemia that he’s been fighting for some time. His white blood cells started destroying his red cells, and he was told it was rapidly getting out of control. At his age (84), they told him this might well be it. Even just a few days could be it... I spoke with him the next day, and he was VERY depressed. “Probably not going home. Won’t see you and Terri again. Lost my Mojo...” These were the kind of things he was saying. Well, Terri and I were so sick, there was NOTHING we could do to help. So I made it a point to call every day, encourage, pray, and at least offer to help every time I did.

THEN, I got a little better, and he was hanging on, trying to keep his spirits up... so I decided to go to the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in Houston to pray my old Rosary for Bruce (and for Vera White at New Life). I’m an old Catholic at heart, and in times of major stress, I do go back and visit a Cathedral and pray. Feels right at times. So, that was a couple days ago. I felt powerful emotions as I prayed. As many might not know, a Rosary is quite a commitment to prayer (60 + prayers), and my old knees pay a price! YET, the tears I felt in my eyes made me feel something profound in my spirit! The prayers gave back TO me as well, as I just felt very much “well” when I returned to my car! Then, later that evening, I made my call to Bruce. He proudly announced that they told him his numbers were all going in the right direction with a great improvement across the board, and he was going home Wednesday. Hooray!!! Blessings in the midst of hardship... God’s own do experience a life that at times is something to behold! ... Amen!

This all adds even more momentum to my strong belief that New Life can have a great year in 2022! We all must work together, pray mightily, take action when possible, and trust such will be well rewarded!







Saturday, February 5 is adopt-a -spot litter cleanup day in Pearland. We will meet at the church at 8:30 A.M. to pick up litter on E. Orange. Bags, gloves, and snacks will be provided. Students can get volunteer credit for school. Thanks to Derrick and Bryce Flick, Becky Homerstad, Terri Kiser, Cheryl Robinson, and Helen Beckman for their participation in the cleanup November 6. We collected 2 ½ bags of trash, a ½ bag of recycling, and 300 cigarette butts.

Saturday, February 19 is Cigarette Litter Awareness Day from noon to 3 P.M. Teams of volunteers will leave from the Stella Roberts Recycling Center to pick up and count Cigarette butts at specific intersections for the annual assessment of cigarette litter in Pearland.



Many of you have been asking questions about recycling at the Stella Roberts Recycling Center (SRRC). I will be going over current rules for the next two months. Frontier Waste is the current waste hauler contracted to the city for curbside pickup as well some items at the recycle center. Some items are sold to help defray the tremendous cost of disposal.

Covid has affected the health of some workers and to ensure safety and efficiency, you are asked to make an appointment, separate your recycling, wear a mask, and stay in your car. Appointments are scheduled in blocks of time, to allow the workers to have time to do the other chores required to manage the recycling. It is expected that when the pandemic is over SRRC will no longer require appointments.

Some costs for recycling are covered by your monthly water bill. Keep Pearland Beautiful has negotiated with Brazoria County and many cities to add support in order to give their citizens free access. Everyone is welcome to bring normal household recycling of metal, glass, paper, and numbers 1-5, and 7plastic at no cost. Plastic bags and similar flimsy plastic are not accepted and can be taken to your grocery store.

There is a fee schedule for certain items that are more expensive to handle. It varies dependent on where you live and whether or not your local government supports the SRRC.

Paper: You can put your newspapers, magazines, catalogs, and junk mail in either of the two paper dumpsters in our church parking lot. No cardboard or phone books are accepted. Paper and cardboard can be put in your curbside bin or taken to the Stella Roberts Recycling Center at no cost to anyone. Food contaminated paper goods belong in the garbage. All paper and cardboard should be clean.

Keep Pearland Beautiful has negotiated with a company for **shredded office paper** that requires the paper be clear of plastic in the windows of envelopes and staples. Taking out the staples and plastic window is very tedious and time consuming for SRRC workers. There is no additional cost if you do it yourself. You can pay \$0.79 per contaminant or a \$20. flat fee for removing all contaminants. All people will pay a \$5. flat rate for up to 4 boxes of paper. Businesses pay \$0.50 per pound for shredding.

Hazardous Waste: Transportation and disposal fees for hazardous waste have gone up tremendously and there is no way Keep Pearland Beautiful (KPB) can make up the difference. In budgeting the costs and fees for the water bill, it seems the city of Pearland neglected to consider household hazardous waste and the Pearland water bills do not include a fee for it. Therefore, for the rest of this budget year at least, **Pearland and most of Brazoria County will be required to pay \$15. for each CRT Tube TV and \$5. for each LED, Plasma TV. For Manvel and Brookside there is no charge with proof of residency. For household hazardous waste, there is no charge for Brazoria County residents except Pearland. Pearland Residents will have to pay \$1.50 per pound.** No resident of Brazoria County has to pay for automotive fluid disposal. Residents of counties not supporting the SRRC pay \$5. for up to 10 gallons.

The recycling fee schedule will be posted at church.




