

New Life Delivers Meals on Wheels every 8 Weeks.

<u>About Meals on Wheels:</u> For more than 20 years community volunteers have been delivering fully prepared meals to senior citizens and the homebound in the Pearland area. It has allowed many individuals to remain independent in their own homes rather than having to move to a care facility. Each Meals on Wheels delivery is made by a driver who also checks on the well-being of each client - bringing peace of mind to the clients and their families.

Equally important are the smiles and companionship that accompany each meal delivery. For many homebound clients, the Meals on Wheels driver is the only person they see during the day.

Nutrition: The nutritious meals served to Meals on Wheels clients are carefully prepared by trained staff in the kitchen of Memorial Hermann Hospital—Pearland.

Special dietary needs, such as low sodium and low sugar are accommodated and every meal meets the 1/3 of the Recommended Daily Allowance (RDA) nutritional needs for adults. Hot meals are delivered Monday through Friday.

Meals on Wheels ... There when it is needed: • Residents in the Pearland area. • All adults (age 18 or older) who are disabled, chronically ill or frail and unable to shop/cook for themselves are eligible for Meals on Wheels service. This program includes individuals who are recuperating from an illness or injury that is keeping them homebound and in need of short term assistance. • Donations and volunteers are needed to continue this valuable service.

<u>Donations:</u> Pearland Meals on Wheels, Inc. is a not for profit corporation run by a board of directors. It is a volunteer-based organization primarily run through leadership from eight local churches. Our organization is funded through donations from these churches, as well as local civic groups and businesses and other generous donors. There is no financial support from the United Way or from state or federal funds; all support comes through the love and caring of local Pearland residents. Your tax deductible donation will help seniors and others continue to live at home - independently and with dignity.

Food pickup and deliver times usually run from 10:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Since eight churches are currently involved in making deliveries, each church delivers meals for one week out of every eight weeks. Therefore, volunteers typically will deliver meals one day every eight weeks. Contact Barbara Flowers if you are able to donate your time once every 8 weeks.

Report of the Bridge Pastor to the Congregation

"Christ Church seeks to be a caring congregation, worshipping God and encouraging one another, as we serve outside the walls of our congregation in the name and spirit of Jesus Christ."

The term "Bridge Pastor" at times can be misleading for during this time it is considered by some as a "place holder" for the "Fulltime" minister who is to come. Nothing could be more misleading. Time and again the leadership of the church have recognized that during the interim time or in my case "bridge ministry" even for a short time a congregation needs to make progress towards her transitional goals, which is vital to the success of the incoming minister. I thank God for permitting me to share and add more to the following "five goals of interim ministry" that we have worked on these past months together.

- 1, "Claiming and honoring the congregation's past and at the same time reflecting on healing its griefs and conflicts."
- 2. "Clarifying the congregation's unique identity: its strengths, its needs and its challenges."
- 3. "Piloting the shifts in leadership that occur during the times of transition and or change."
- 4. "Renewing connections, discovering resources within and looking at the promising horizon ahead."
- 5. "Enabling the congregation to renew its vision, strengthen its stewardship, and engage its future with great anticipation and zest."

In the interim and bridge period the congregation again reclaims its fundamental calling that the future of the church belongs to its membership. Whether it moves forward or back, whether it grows or withers, whether it thrives or try to survive for lack of assistance. No one else is more responsible for the life, witness, and ministry of New Life Lutheran Church for that accountability is placed on the shoulders of each member of the church.

I believe that after this interim time the congregation is now ready to greet your next pastor. A minister with a strength and vision, skills and energies that may be wholly distinct and spiritually motivating from what the congregation experienced in the past. That is our hope and prayer that the future may bring rather than an attempt to replace the past.

At first, I'm not sure if this congregation was prepared for a "Bridge Pastor" though reformed but with a different theological background and church orientation. Be that as it may we have spent nearly almost a quarter together, and it was such a blessing to be here with you. The congregation's welcome, hospitality and affability extended to me, and my family was such a wonderful experience.

I know that the coming days will be exciting for all of you. As your committee will discover what ministers interested in your congregation hope to find here, and somewhere in that conversation it is my hope and prayer a good match will be made. Again, the ministry and the mission of this congregation is in your hands as each of you will make a strong personal investment in the future of this congregation.

I appreciate all our church members who participate in the life of our congregation through their worship attendance (in person or online), those who I had the pleasure of meeting over the phone, offering valuable volunteer hours and financial support of our congregation. I especially want to thank the leadership of our council member group of 2021 and 2022, the women's group, quilters group, and our office staff for their support and unwavering commitment to serve even in this challenging times of the pandemic. I also want to mention members who took the time to remember me during the Christmas season for their generosity and well wishes.

"The Call Committee was recently given 2 candidates for consideration by the Synod. We have currently completed our initial interviews and hope to have our secondary interviews completed in the next few weeks. Once we have completed our secondary interviews our options to proceed are to either offer one of the candidates the option to become our principle candidate for pastor at New Life or we also have the option to say that we don't think either candidate is a good fit and we would then need to ask for additional candidates from the synod. Once we have selected a principle candidate, that candidate is then presented to the church council. If, and when, the church council and the principle candidate agree to a compensation and benefits package, that is when we can present the candidate to the full New Life congregation for their consideration. After the candidate is presented to the congregation, a congregational meeting is called and the congregation will vote on whether to extend the pastoral call to the candidate that has been presented. If the congregation agrees to extend an offer and the candidate accepts, that is when we will have our new pastor.

In our discussion with the synod, it is our understanding that this process, from the time our interviews started, to the time that the candidate is accepted by the congregation, is generally 2-3 months, although that timeline can vary. We know that you all have been so patient with us in this process and we greatly appreciate that. We continue to work diligently, but ask for your prayers of discernment, wisdom, and guidance as we embark on the last leg of this journey. We promise that as soon as we can tell you more about a pastoral candidate, we will. In the meanwhile, if you have any questions about this process, please feel free to reach out to one of the call committee members, which include: Bubba Flowers, Peter Weber, Abby Roszak, Susan Butler, Helen Beckman, Jill Olson, Bryan Bradford, and Suzie Wellman. The only questions we are unable to answer are questions about the identities and backgrounds of our candidates."

For now, the only charge to Pearland residents is a \$5 charge for paper shredding, and an additional charge if it contains envelopes with plastic windows or staples, and \$1.50 a pound for Household Hazardous Waste. Donations are always welcome.

So, you've had your garage sale and donated reusables to the resale shop. Don't throw away the leftover textiles. Check with the quilters. They can always use scrap material and sheets. What they can't use will go into stuffing for dog beds. Also, the orange bag people, Simple Recycling, have been replaced by Green City Recycler. Set items in a bag or box on your front porch by 7 A.M. the day of your appointment. No appointment is needed if you drop it in the bin in front and to the right of the Stella Roberts Recycling Center 24/7.

Accepted items are: Bedding, Clothing, Coats and Jackets, Curtains/Draperies, Fashion accessories, Costumes, Purses, Hats and Gloves, Linens, Pet Beds and Clothing, Pillows, Shoes, Sandals, Slippers, Sleeping Bags, Stuffed Animals.


