Pastor's Page

To the good people of New Life Lutheran Church,

NEW THINGS ARE COMING!

Greetings! I have been asked to offer a few words of introduction. My name is Pastor Grant Housewright, and have been asked to be New Life's Sunday pulpit supply person for

the next few weeks, the short gap before your new pastor arrives.

I am a retired ELCA pastor, having moved to Houston in 2001, tackling retirement in September of 2020. Nancy and I have three daughters. Nancy teaches piano out of our home.

Highlighting a piece of scripture, from Paul's second letter to the people of Corinth, 5th chapter: "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come."

"New things have come", is a faith-mindset in a couple of ways. First, you and a new pastor are crossing a bridge to new things for both of you. I can just imagine your excitement, especially after many months of a journey. New life means new growth, new directions and fresh ideas regarding how your mission with spill out of your church doors and into the community. May the Holy Spirit be your guide and your stay of strength and patience!

Wait. There's more I'll put out, here. As we look at lives as Christians, in just a few short weeks, we'll celebrating more new life. However, that "new" cannot be observed or even provide a hint of joy without first stepping on to the bridge that takes us there. We, at this very moment are on the bridge -- our Sunday scriptures have taken us on Jesus' journey from the wilderness to his entry into Jerusalem, to the garden where he was arrested, that offensive, accusatory, defensive and so-called trial and conversation with Pilate, to the cross, to the agonizing death, to the grave, from three days in the tomb, to the few men and women witnessing the first day of Easter!

What a bridge. What a message! The journey from observing Jesus to witnessing to others what has happened. This is us -- this is the other end of the bridge, which has taken us to new life. Both of these journeys take time: between pastors at New Life and Ash Wednesday to Easter.

What about the time in between? Keep worshipping, listening, inviting, loving, showing mercy, forgiving and being kind.

Thank you for allowing me to be with you, even for this short period of time - be at peace!

"First of all, just a word to let you know I have spoken with our Pastoral Candidate! 






Lawn Care now includes the back field so the total needed is now \$560 per month for the field and front of the property.




