Pastor's Page

To the Good Folks at New Life

I would like for us to look at a very special day that always falls 40 days after Easter: Ascension Day. This year: May 26. It commemorates the Christian belief of the bodily ascension of Jesus into heaven.

Luke 24:50-53 tells us: *When he had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands and blessed them. While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven. Then they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God.*

Yes, the ascension points us to the uniqueness of Jesus, as God and man, God in the flesh, incarnation and, specifically to Jesus as Lord on the throne, but it also points to the uniqueness and value of each human life. We believe that Jesus' humanness does not end with his resurrection or his ascension. The particularity of his human personhood, is eternal. Now carry that through to us. It becomes equally true that our personhood, our individuality, will not just melt away into nothingness with death either. This is our uniqueness, too! We also are intended for eternity as human beings.

Jesus' ascension is the hinge between Luke's Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles (also written by Luke), for Acts is not a new story but the continuation of the story of Jesus' mission and ministry through the work of his apostles and disciples. As we are told in Acts, Jesus, while physically absent for a period of time, "will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." What is truly interesting for you and me and all Christianity is not Jesus' coming and going, but the ongoing reality of Jesus' existing eternally.

As a result, and this is what really grabs us, the ascension is not the END of Jesus' mission but the BEGINNING of the church's mission. Jesus' ascension takes place only "after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles," creating an even deeper encounter with Jesus. Simply put, Jesus promises the apostles the Holy Spirit, "power from on high."

Now the rub: As Jesus spoke in terms of the restoration of the kingdom to Israel, it seems they're still thinking in terms of a physical kingdom. Since "after his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God," it is not a surprise that it would be on their minds.

Yet Jesus' kingship is not about establishing a kingdom by conquering and destroying the enemy. The only enemies Jesus has are those that have already been conquered through his resurrection: death and suffering. The victory of the kingdom of God is not about building castles and fortifying walls to keep people out, but about inviting others in to enjoy God's reign. This is why when the apostles ask whether this is the time to restore the kingdom, Jesus' response is to send them out to the world: "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Since each human life, body and soul, is valuable, each person deserves to hear the saving story of Jesus' life. Jesus took on human life, became incarnate, exactly for this purpose: to save our unique human lives. And Jesus retains his human uniqueness as the ascended Lord as a model for our future life and in order that each of us in our individuality and personhood can share in eternal life. He will come again as the same Jesus, a person like us, to welcome us to enjoy the kingdom of God: life eternal with all of our singularity and personhood intact.

Herein lies some great and comforting news for you and me, friends.

God's peace be with all of you always and forever!

And, thank you to our Executive Team (Vanessa, Mary Ann Marcha, and John Garrett).

Now, let’s get to the news at hand. There is only one item that now dominates the New Life landscape, dwarfing all other issues. We are finally in the home stretch in the process of finding a new Pastor for our precious church! At this point, the negotiations between Dr. Faulkner and Vanessa and the Executive Team, are complete. The full Council has met and interviewed Dr. Faulkner. All terms and conditions have been agreed to. The next step is the Congregational meeting (and vote) after the service on May 1, 2022!

Dr. Faulkner (soon to be “Pastor Faulkner”) is assisting Pastor Grant with the single 9:30 service Sunday (May 1st), and, he is delivering the sermon. Immediately following that service a congregational meeting will be held, for the express propose of voting. By the time you read this, the congregation will have officially voted to make him our new Pastor! While I am very enthusiastic about him, as is the Council and the Call Committee, it is up to you the members of New Life Lutheran Church to make the final decision.

It is my trust and belief that we are all ready to get back to “normal” as a church, and move forward into a bright and faithful future! I look forward to making that journey with you all...

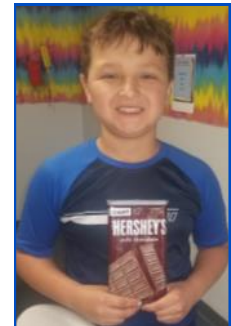
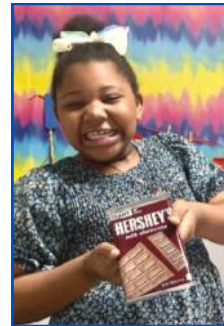
Bryan Bradford, Beth Moore & Becca Reed lead the 3 year olds – 1st graders. Bible intros using Veggie Tales material and other curriculum.

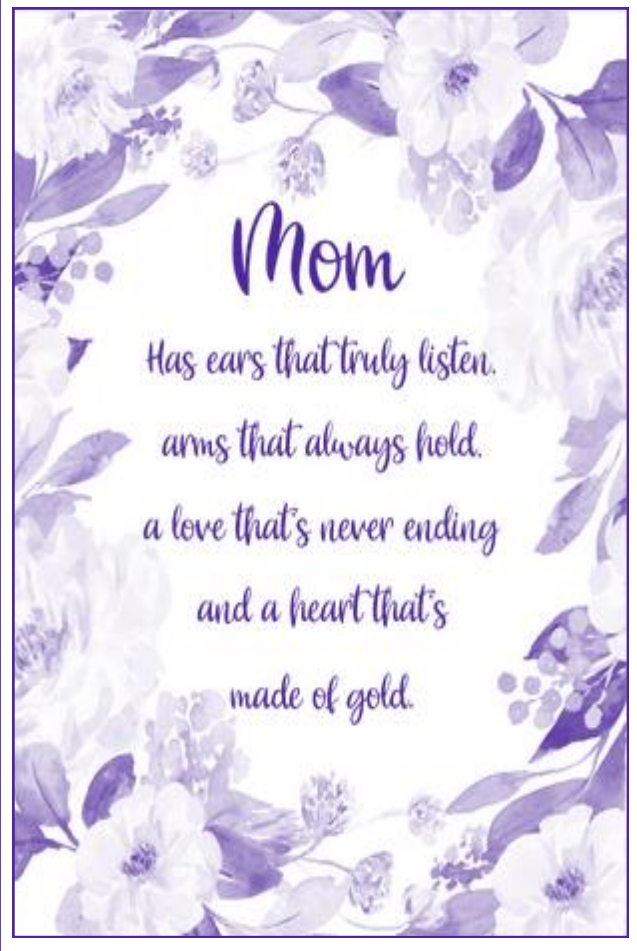
