She had looked at chickens at the grocery store the previous week, but they were too expensive for her. So, I gave her a small, whole chicken, and she promised me that she would make chicken and noodles for herself.

The next month, Louise returned and thanked me again for the chicken. As she spoke, her blue eyes sparkled! She did make the chicken and noodles, and also invited a friend to share lunch with her. After her lunch, she had divided her leftovers and sent half of them home with her friend! What a kind, generous soul!

I saw Louise's obituary in The Times in December, 2017. She was 90 years old, and in her younger days, had driven a school bus for 40 years! I feel privileged to have known her, and will truly miss talking with her. Does God send angels to our food pantry? Absolutely! Sometimes they are disguised as "Louise".

a note from your lead pastor ...

**We are well on our Lenten journeys** ... this coming Sunday is our 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Lent. Our worship and study focus is *Walking the Journey of Lent*. Sunday school classes, Wednesday morning Bible study and 20+ folks are gathering Wednesday evenings for Soup and Study with Pat Mosley. Amen!

**How is your Lenten journey?** Lent may be seen as "spring training" for Christ followers. Just like the baseball players who have been called to spring camp, we, too, have this opportunity to prepare ourselves in three ways: 1. Getting in shape 2. Practicing fundamentals – prayer, worship, giving, fasting, ... 3. Developing a positive mental attitude. As we read in Joel 2:13a – "Return to me (God) with your whole heart...rend your hearts and not your garments, and return to the Lord, your God." We are called to become the very holiness of God. Daunting, isn't it? Thankfully, it is a journey! And we do not travel this journey alone ... Jesus walks with us and we journey *together*.

**On February 11, Transfiguration Sunday** (the Sunday which precedes Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent) I preached on 'Glory Sightings.' After worship and many times that week several of you shared with me *your Glory Sightings*. I thank you for your sharing, and more importantly, I am grateful you are aware of *God at work among us*, and moving in your life!

**Ash Wednesday** – in addition to our Wednesday evening worship we offered "Drive-thru" ashes from 6:15am to 8:15am and from 11:30am to 12:30pm. When this was shared on Facebook I noticed that one person's response was "Is this a joke?" No joke! Pastor Donna and I had spoken about this last year, and this idea also "bubbled up" organically from one of the Sunday school classes. So! We made it happen. Dave Dean provided materials for a welcoming campfire – which provided welcoming light and warmth. In the morning we provided coffee, with ashes and prayer. Pauline Luthi joined me in the morning and at noon; each person also received a handmade Valentine (made by our Learning League students) and Lenten readings. In all, we made connections with 9 people – some a part of our congregation and two "visitors." We also greeted many of our neighbors, who left their homes for the day, or walked their dogs. Was it a "success?" Yes! We may tweak it a bit for next year ... it is an instrumental way to make a way ... to invite others into the Lord's presence, and for us to be in theirs. *I was blessed*. Thank you Dave and Pauline for making it happen!

**Holy Week** – begins with **Palm Sunday**, March 25. Our choir will present their Cantata – "*The Power of the Cross*". Thursday evening, **Maundy Thursday**, we will worship at 7:00 pm. The focus of worship will be "service." Friday evening, the darkest of days in our Christian calendar, **Good Friday** worship, will be a Service of Tenebrae, also at 7:00pm.

**Easter morning – April 1.** We will worship, and it will be glorious! To fully realize the splendor and glory of Easter, it is important to journey Lent with intention ... and to worship at least once during Holy Week. Easter is our hinge-point as Christ followers. *I hope to see you in worship!*

**Moms Demand Action** – I attended the organizational meeting Saturday February 24 in Valparaiso (at a United Methodist Church), and joined this national chapter. Moms Demand Action – for gun sense in America. I am standing with the young people of Parkland, Florida. On the average, 7 people are killed in the United States each day due to gun violence. African Americans are killed 10x more than white people. I am working for, taking action for, justice. How is your faith leading you?

**Godspell** — presented by our Genesis Guild — March 2, 3, 4 and 9, 10 and 11. Fridays and Saturdays, 8:00pm, Sunday afternoons at 3:00pm. We had a sneak preview in worship February 25. I hope to see you there!

It’s so exciting to witness God’s hand moving in and through the people at First Church! Everywhere I look, God is working. Unfortunately, far too often we are so focused on “what used to be” or “what’s not happening” that we don’t notice what God is actually doing. Why is that? Maybe it’s because our heads are too full of our own plans and ideas, or because things are not happening the way we want them to happen, or because our eyes are not looking in the right direction. No matter what the reason, let me assure you that God IS working right here at First United Methodist Church in Hammond Indiana . . . one person at a time!

How can I be so sure of this? Because I am honored to witness to the amazing things God is doing in the hearts and lives of individuals on a daily basis. Although I see God working everywhere, the one place I see Him moving is in the lives of the women who participate in the Wednesday morning Bible study. There are so many stories to tell and so many transformations taking place that all I can say is WOW! Over the years we have moved from light book studies [always Christian books!] to discussing Sunday sermons, to lively discussions on current topics, and the past few years we have grown into life-transforming in-depth study of Scripture. It has been amazing to witness all the “Ah-Ha” moments when someone really gets what God is saying. And not only gets it, but actually puts it into action. It has been so encouraging to me personally to have played a small role in facilitating the class discussions as the Holy Spirit teaches the lessons God wants each individual to learn.

Let me share just one story that comes to mind. [There are many!] One woman has been working for years with an “extra-grace-required” person and their relationship was rocky, to say the least. For whatever reason, they just didn’t get along. Then, one day— after we had a lively discussion in class about trying to reach the people who are hard to reach--she felt the leading of the Holy Spirit to speak to this EGR person differently than she had in the past, and low-and-behold, the co-worker’s attitude towards her changed. Not over time, but immediately! Now, even though they aren’t quite good friends, [yet!] they get along and the work environment is much more peaceful.

Some might say this is a coincidence. I say it is a *God-incidence*. God IS working in the hearts and minds of His children -- all the time. We must simply pay attention and listen for His “still small voice.” More than likely God is not going to call you to move to Africa, Asia, or South America to be a missionary. But He is calling you on a daily basis to “start with the person nearest to you,” no matter who, or how unpleasant, that person might be. God wants to use you to touch their life with His love and grace. Are you paying attention?

## Children's Ministry

2017 was a successful year for Children's Ministry in our church. So far in 2018, Children's Ministry has worked to refresh the nursery and Sunday School rooms to better meet the needs of our children. This continues to be a work in progress. Currently we have more school age children than babies/pre-k, so we are working to create a space that meets the needs of this age group. Children have requested puzzles, board games, and Legos for this space, which we are working to gather, clean and organize these items. The junior church room will come next!

Sunday School children are working to create a display to decorate the food pantry and encourage these families to get involved in our programming.

The nursery has changed formats at this time. There is no longer a paid staff member in this position, so the nursery is only open when there is a volunteer or when a parent stays in the room with the child. I have created a signup sheet and will write announcements to encourage others to volunteer. Nursery volunteers will be asked to supervise children only after the children's message (last 15-20 minutes of the service).

Mike Kizman's Pineapple Heritage group got started last week and will sing at the 10:30 service monthly. More children are needed and welcome! Children's Ministry needs volunteers! We have strong leaders running many of our programs, but extra adults are needed to help monitor larger groups and meet the child safety guidelines. Please spread the word that a volunteer will not be thrown into managing a group alone—extra adults help with passing out and cleaning up supplies, walking little ones to the restroom, etc.
