a note from your lead pastor ...

Since the last edition of our newsletter, we have celebrated Easter! *Christ is risen, Christ is risen, indeed!* A big thank you *to everyone* who contributed to both of our Easter services, each service was distinct and special. Splendid Easter flowers, varied and exceptional music, Easter splendor, and both of your pastors donning God goggles for Children's Time! Easter morning is



always a relief for me ... after the ups and downs of Holy Week. It is the nature of Holy Week, my emotions and my very self walks with Christ. I am never certain when my low point during Holy Week will come; this year it was during the day of Maundy Thursday. Therefore, ever more important for me to be in prayer and worship during Holy Week. Again, thank you to all who took part in Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday worship.

Monday following Easter I was honored to be invited to be part of a presentation panel titled, "Rebel Moms," (not the original title!) at Calumet College St. Joseph. Five of us were invited to share in ways we stand against the status quo to bring about positive transformation in our communities. I shared that panel presentation with exceptional company!

The week following Easter I had the opportunity to travel to Washington, D.C., to take part in the **A.C.T. to End Racism Rally**, on the 50th anniversary of the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr. My son, Michael (14 years old), and I traveled for the day with members of the Indiana United Methodist Extended Cabinet. This Rally was organized by the National Council of Churches. A.C.T. = Awaken, Confront, Transform.

AWAKEN TO ACKNOWLEDGE. CONFESS TO CONFRONT. TELL THE TRUTH TO TRANSFORM. We stood (and sometimes sat on the ground) of the National Mall and listened to incredible and inspirational messages and music. We heard messages from: REV. JULIAN DESHAZIER Senior Pastor, University Church of Chicago, REV. JIM WALLIS President and Founder, Sojourners, REV. DR. JENNIFER HARVEY Author, Dear White Christians: For Those Still Longing for Racial Reconciliation, DR. FREDERICK D. HAYNES, III Senior Pastor Friendship West Baptist Church (Dallas, TX), RT. REV. VASHTI MURPHY MCKENZIE Presiding Prelate, Tenth Episcopal District African Methodist Episcopal Church, DANNY GLOVER Actor, film director, and political activist, ... and more. The musical artists included Y'ANNA CRAWLEY Urban Contemporary Gospel Artist and Musician, YOLANDA ADAMS Gospel Singer, Record Producer and Actress, and others. It was a very emotional day.

I have often asked myself, what would I have done in the 60's during the Civil Rights movement, when Martin Luther King, Jr. led us into a different world, a world with a needed new type of justice? I can say today, that I would have joined those marches, the Civil Rights movement, and not from the sidelines. *I ask myself today*, "Where is God calling me to A.C.T., where is God asking me, expecting me – *counting on me*, to be a "Rebel Mom?" To be a Rebel Pastor? Here is part of my response to God ... "You (God) have called me to this place, at this time, to serve as Lead Pastor of Hammond First UMC; this Body of Christ is situated in a location at this time in history to serve in a unique way. You (God) have assembled us, with individual and collective gifts, graces, and experiences to accomplish something transforming. Continue to show us the way, your way." *Are you able to feel this*, ... *too*? God is stirring something inside of me, and providing experiences so that we may bring transformation in the world, to make a difference.

As I shared in worship April 22, a funny thing happened on the way to the pulpit, the week of April 15 to the 22nd, after having centered on the scripture, Acts 4:11 *This Jesus is the stone you builders rejected; he has become the cornerstone!* As I leaned into the work of sermon preparation, I was flooded with cornerstone images, facts, realities. I realized late Saturday evening and early Sunday morning it was not to be a message ... it had transformed into a sermon series. Stay tuned as we hear more about: *Christ being our foundation, our cornerstone, within these contexts:* (1) The United Methodist Church – we celebrated 50 years April 23, 2018 – with the union of the Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren Church (EUB) (2) Hammond First UMC Foundation (3) The Church Universal (4) Our *personal* relationships with Jesus. In worship on the 22nd we learned about the actual cornerstones of Hammond First UMC. We have three – dated 1906, 1954, 1966. Have you taken the opportunity to find them, look at them? *Gosh, we have a very rich history!*





A Word From Finance.....

First Quarter financial reports show that we have a strong Current Expense balance of \$31,308. This is the money we have on hand to pay our bills. Our average monthly expenses are about \$22,000. They are higher in summer and winter and lower in spring and fall. Collective individual giving was weak but we had income from other sources. We collected \$56,000 and had expenses of \$71,000. We expect to have a strong Current Expense balance for the first half of the year, but the second half will be a serious challenge.

Several of our members have begun giving directly from their IRAs. This can have a significant tax advantage for the giver. If you are interested in finding out more about this option, ask Bob Brown or better yet speak to your financial advisor.

Electronic giving is available for anyone who wants to choose this means of giving. There is a minor cost associated with it, but having this means of giving is a plus for First Church. We do receive revenue that we otherwise would not receive.
