A strange thing happened to me a couple of months ago which really "shocked" me! A lady in my water aerobics class said she overheard me talk about my church and wanted to know what church I attended, where it was and what time the services were. Did I invite like I should have? No. God gave me the opportunity, but I failed; however, she came the following Sunday at 8:30 and sat with me! When she spotted the title of my Sunday School book, she couldn't believe her eyes and asked if she could come to Sunday School class as "Forgiveness" was the exact help she was needing.
