The Pasta Dinner proceeds + 2nd Mile Giving raised over \$4000.00 (*WOW!*) Despite this huge success, the cost for a new playground – and she attributes this to our intention, our prayers and our efforts. On the weekend of May 18-19, the event "Helium Hope" took place – Helium Hope was a vision by Pastor G. Thomas of Gary Christ UMC. It was an ecumenical north Indiana event featuring the keynote speaker, Rev. Dr. Ron Archer. Additionally, there were musical and rap artists, and other speakers who presented their messages. Ron Archer was p.o.w.e.r.f.u.l.! His story and his ability to share his story is lifechanging. I am planning on projecting one of his video messages in worship and preaching from it. A Way Forward – In February 23-26, 2019, a special General Conference of the United Methodist Church will take place in St. Louis, Missouri, to look at how our denomination will look at LGBTQ inclusion.

The Commission on a Way Forward (a 32-member Commission, appointed by the Council of Bishops in 2016) has sent their proposal to the Council of Bishops – who met May 2018, in Chicago. There are three model options that this Commission wrote:

The three options, in no particular order, are:

- Affirm the current Book of Discipline language and place a high value on accountability. The church policy book says the practice of homosexuality "is incompatible with Christian teaching" and lists officiating at a same-gender union or being a "self-avowed practicing" gay clergy member, as chargeable offenses under church law.
- Remove the Book of Discipline's restrictive language and place a high value on contextualization. This sketch also specifically protects the rights of those whose conscience will not allow them to perform samegender weddings or ordain LGBTQ people.
- Create multiple branches that have clearly defined values such as accountability, contextualization and justice. This model would maintain shared doctrine and services and one Council of Bishops. There will be additional opportunities to learn more; I will be leading a four-week small group study, titled, "Living Faithfully, Human Sexuality and The United Methodist Church." Additionally, everyone is invited by Bishop Trimble to attend "Bishop's Call to Conversation A Way Forward," at the Valparaiso UMC Sunday August 5, 2:00 p.m. As your pastor, I want to do my best to be certain we at Hammond First UMC are informed on this very important historical decision.

I look forward seeing you in worship and around the church!

It can be through people, books, nature, and sometimes even everyday objects, like this past Christmas, when I gave a friend a small glass ball with sand and seashells inside. It is similar to the one I have had in my bathroom for years. It has always intrigued me. I love shaking it occasionally, just to see how the contents are rearranged.



My friend loved it! In part, her thank you note read, "Thank you for the shells in the sand ball. Looking back, we can see that with every shake the changes and challenges have brought with them opportunities for spiritual growth and new ministries. She was an active soloist and accompanist and also performed as a piano duo with Josette Behrend. She was an adjudicator, clinician and certified member of local, state and national associations of music teachers (MTNA).

Margaret Nichols is survived by her children and their families. Her life was celebrated in private family gatherings.
