We are in the midst of Lent ... it has been challenging for me to once again read, *not a fan. becoming a completely committed follower of jesus,* by Kyle Idleman. Challenging as I read and apply the concepts to my life, prepare the sermons, and be involved with the Book Study Conversation Wednesday evenings of Lent. Lent should be challenging. It is designed to be challenging. I am becoming more of a completely committed follower of Jesus. And you?

Palm Sunday is April 14, the Sunday before Easter. Palm Sunday begins Holy Week – there will be a variety of opportunities to worship Holy Week. **Maundy Thursday** evening we worship at 7:00 p.m., the theme for this evening's worship is 'service.' **Good Friday** is a somber and reflective worship, we begin at 7:00 p.m., and will conclude in near darkness and quiet. **Easter** then, April 21, *is the holiest of holy days*, is the hinge point of our faith, our belief, of Christianity. Easter is the most glorious of worship days! The chapel and the sanctuary will be gloriously alive, as we celebrate Christ's resurrection! I look forward to it!

April will be a season of renewal and transition. Our Pastor Donna 'retires' at the end of this month. We will celebrate in worship Sunday April 28, and afterwards, with a reception. As Pastor Donna Beifuss transitions into a new phase in her life, we transition with her and congratulate her on so many rich facets of her service at First Church, and continuing life and service here. *Thank you, Donna*.

Following Easter, **the Judicial Council** of The United Methodist Church will rule on the portions of the Traditional Plan and amendments that are in question for their constitutionality. The Traditional Plan was voted in by a small majority at the Special Called General Conference in February. *Stay tuned*!

Hammond First **was a host site for Lay Academy,** four Sundays in March -- there were six different classes held – it has been exciting! Kathy Smith, Pam Longhi and Pauline Luthi have provided radical hospitality to our guests and students. I led Beginning Preaching – with a total capacity of 8 students. Four students in Beginning Preaching are from Hammond First – you will be hearing more from them! There have been a total of 7 students from First Church in Lay Academy classes. Lay Academy is a wonderful opportunity for laity to learn more about the church and to become involved in a different way.

A Coming Attraction! ... the birth of two visitation ministries, here at Hammond First. *One ministry* equips members for regular visitation of our folks. *A second visitation ministry* equips members for hospital visitation, in place of your pastor. Training for both of these ministries will be this spring.

And lastly, ... Sunday April 7, following 10:30 worship, an ETC class. ETC stands for "Explore the Church," and is an opportunity to learn more about the Church and this church – whether you have just begun attending worship or have been churched your whole life. This class does meet the requirements to become a member of the church – *though this is not its sole design or purpose*.

The children are at our church from 3pm to 6pm Monday to Friday during the school year when school is in session. The Learning League provides a safe place for children to be and where they can have help with their homework, get something to eat, and have fun; but most importantly of all, they feel loved and nurtured by the volunteers and staff. April's Second Mile Giving will help fund this wonderful ministry.

Kenwood School would like to have a laminating machine; Pauline Luthi has notified me that they have been having fundraising events to raise money for a laminating machine. They will be having another fundraising event in the near future. Please stay tuned for the date of the fundraising event and for more details. Pauline Luthi has also notified me that she would like the mission team to help with publicizing the fundraising events. A Blessing Box! Thanks to the Girl Scout Cadettes, *Shayla Deering and Keelin Kizman*, we will have a Blessing Box installed on our property Sunday March 31. Shayla and Keelin have had the vision for this Blessing Box – which they first saw at a church in Griffith. This completed project will also earn these two Cadettes their Silver Scouting Award. *Keelin and Shayla are the first Hammond Cadettes in over 15 years to earn a Silver Award*. This is a distinctive honor, that has taken a lot of hard work. Of course they have had great assistance and support – *but the project is theirs*. This vision will become reality on Sunday March 31 when the box is installed and blessed, following 10:30 a.m. worship. (Sunday March 31 is also Girl Scout Sunday.) A prayer box will also accompany this Blessing Box.

The Blessing Box concept originated in Oklahoma. In doing some research I (Richard) found out that it is a ministry based on the scripture Acts 20:35 – "In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we should help others and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how He himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive." Richard has also found out that the Blessing Box as had great success. A sign on the Blessing Box will say:

Take what you need Bring what you can Above all, be blessed

Anyone in the community of Hammond will have access to the Blessing Box, 24 hours a day 7 days a week, and the mission team will be responsible for checking it daily. We may be part of this blessing too, by contributing needed items – there will be a collection box in the mission corner for this purpose.

Needed items: nonperishable food items, diapers, hats, scarves, women's personal hygiene items, books, needs.

This project proposal has been presented to Trustees, SPRC and the Chair of Church Council – all of whom gave their enthusiastic support. Mike Kizman is the troop leader for Keelin and Shayla. **What a blessing!**




