a note from your pastor...

First Church showed your appreciation of your pastor in so many ways during the month of October. You shared hugs, greetings, cards, notes, gifts, lunches, a very cute seasonal door hanger, very special thoughtfulnesses ... flowers, cake after worship October 27 and a *lovely* carry-in luncheon Wednesday October 30. You are 'top shelf!' Thank you for all of this demonstration of appreciation!

I am currently in my 13th year of ordained ministry, following 20 years of active nursing. Both of these vocations are 'callings.' They are different from one another, and alike in that they are both service professions. The first vocation, I happened upon as a senior in high school; I sought a profession that was challenging, diverse, provided well, and had good job probability. I am grateful for my nursing education and experience. *Priceless.* I was working 10 years as a nurse when a voice inside of me (I thought it was my voice) said to me, "You won't be working as a nurse the rest of your life." I replied, "Oh, what will that be, then?" The inner voice stated, "Keep doing what you are doing until you figure it out."

I later learned that this inner voice was God, or the Holy Spirit, speaking to me. It took 10+ more years to figure it all out ... that God was calling me into ordained ministry. In that 10 years, I became churched, married, had children, was very active in my home church. All of this was part of the path to hear on May 5, 2002 that God was calling me into ordained ministry. I heard it in the voice of my pastor, part of his sermon message that day was this:

"I sense that there is someone among us who is hearing God call them to do something. Sometimes we cannot grasp all that God asks us to do; but our God is a God of possibility, not impossibility. God will open doors that need to be opened."

Without knowing that is what I needed to hear, this is what I needed to hear. It was this message that finally sent me to my pastor's office for me to blurt out the words: "I think God is calling me to ordained ministry."

What a journey it has been, since that day in May 2002. The high moments have been higher than I could imagine. The challenging and difficult times, have been more challenging and more difficult that I could imagine. And all of these times have been held in God's grasp, knowing the Holy Spirit is with me ...

Many years ago my aunt gave my mother a magnet for her refrigerator that says: *Motherhood is Not for Wimps*. I often think of this magnet and rephrase it to say, *Ministry is Not for Wimps!* I am reminded of this iceberg image --

Those 10+ years that I wondered what I was going to do with my future ... I learned to trust and to pray. To know that what I was doing at that time was my 'job, my calling.' That, in time, it would all get figured out.

God wooed me into ordained ministry using a beautiful love language, actually languages. God called to me and wooed me in pragmatic ways, and in beautiful visions that were multi-sensory.

Therefore, due to the power of the call that God got me to say "yes," this powerful call gives me an ever present spiritual strength that I am living out the call God has planned for me. For 17 years I no longer wake up in the morning and ask, "What am I to do with my future?" Though of course I do not know exactly what my future holds, I do know that I am on the path God has planned for me. This knowledge gives me the grace God feels is sufficient for me ... to continue on. To continue with the confidence and joy the Holy Spirit provides for me, serving and encouraging others (often with phenomenal experiences), preaching, and the fruitfulness that is an outcome of the ministry I am involved with.

God's sufficient grace also sees me through disappointments (my own and others), daily goals, time, expenses, tears, rejection, sacrifice, keeping healthy habits, sleepless nights, gossip, judgements, spiritual warfare, others' expectations.

Ultimately, it is the Holy Spirit and me, that must carry on. *But*, when others love as <u>Jesus with skin on</u>, as you have during Pastor Appreciation Month, your grace joins God's sufficient grace, and your pastor is buoyed by this additional grace.

And this is priceless, too! I am so encouraged! pastor Mary

This is where we left off from the October newsletter:

After further work on administrative sharing and planning we closed our retreat with closing comments and worship with Communion in the Villa Maria Chapel. This leadership/spiritual retreat was a meaningful time for me as pastor — who is called and appointed to lead this local church, Hammond First United Methodist Church. My goal of church leadership: have us all in the same boat, paddles in the water, rowing together

We had great discussions, I will continue to process these conversations for continued dialogue and learning Grooming and Growing Leadership

Continue to look at our past, our present and looking to our future, reviewing processes: to quote our Conference Superintendent Rev. Dr. Saneto Maiko, "How is that working for you?"

Continuing to explore Stages of Team Growth: Forming, Storming, Norming, Performing

Getting away allowed us to get to know one another in different and deeper ways, to share thoughts, ideas, dreams – in spacious time. *I am encouraged, hopeful, uplifted and motivated!*

Picking up, now with a November article:

Administrative Leadership met October 22. We began with a devotion and discussion on Exodus 30:1-31:17. God gave the Israelites directions on how to construct the Ark of the Covenant. We discussed how God gave precise, detailed, and purposeful instructions and how this passage speaks to us today, with our work at First Church? This is what we shared:

We need to plan out our own work

We have people with different gifts, needed to do the work

Tools which we have:

Ourselves

Identify who can help us! Ask, observe

PRAY – for guidance, mobilize the people in this Body who have gifts to work together

Make detailed plans – and then know when we need to 'flex'

We have different and not yet identified gifts/talents needed

Our plan for that meeting:

Metaphorically: To continue to work so that we are in the same boat, oars in the water at the same time, rowing in sync, rowing in the same direction.

Concretely:

Make a decision on our course

To identify needs, wants, dreams; prioritize the needs and wants; review the dreams

In a nutshell, discussions and plans:

We are all "in"

We want to reach out to our communities and be missional – this involves building relationships with them WHILE serving

Some healing needs to take place – let us reconnect and go forward, continuing to build healthy, accountable, discipled relationships

(Administrative Leadership, continued)

Fulfill our mission – raise the bar, define and share what a disciple is and do it

Discern a vision

Continue vibrant and full worship

Experience a revival in First Church

Experience renovation in First Church

Additional discussion: there may be 'more,' but for now, we felt that these spoken specifics and generalities cover our current 'where do we want to go?'

Other sharing from the group: We are willing to sacrifice; we are willing to do what is needed. We recognize that this needs to be shared with the congregation – and find the best way to communicate this 'what are we willing to do?'

Our self-established ground rules:

We will meet this evening "until we accomplish what we need to."

We will support one another

We will be generous, honest, open, with one another.

We will continue to build relationships and establish trust with one another.

We will pray for one another, and for our church.

We will not always know the answers.

We accept this as a long learning and 'doing' process – not a short task

We will accept assignments with a time line

We will put the church first, not competing agendas, not ourselves, we will work as a team, recognizing we are working for the 'greater good'

The assembled group identified the first priorities:

Stove for parsonage

Sanctuary work: projection and sound

Choir Director/Organist

Financial "stuff"

Foundation conversation



I recently read an article entitled "5 Reasons You Need to Make Church a Weekly Commitment" by *I Believe*, which explains it better than I could.


